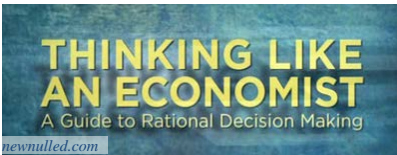


# WHY MAJOR OR MINOR IN ECONOMICS?
