This course is designed to provide a fundamental understanding of the data, theories, and methodology of research in the areas of learning and motivation, stemming primarily from work with non-human subjects, although not restricted to that.

Grading will be based on three exams of a mixed short answer and essay type, on class performance, and on written assignments. Each exam will count for approximately 25% of the course grade. The final exam will not be cumulative; it will merely be the third exam.

Attendance is required at all class meetings; unexcused missed classes will have a negative effect on the course grade.

Textbook assignments will be in the order in which the chapters appear in the textbook. In addition, other reading material may be assigned.

Finally (and I dislike saying this), all work is to be each student's own. Violation of this requirement will result, at a minimum, in a failing grade for the course.
