Anthropology Electives

12 hours of additional courses at the 2900 - 4000 levels

These may include Independent Readings, Independent Research, as well as Study Abroad. Students should discuss their personal and professional interests with the undergraduate adviser before selecting elective courses to complete the major.

Related Courses

The requirement of 18 related hours is to be met with two sub-requirements: ARTH 2200 (Ethnographic Art) & LING 3150 (Linguistic Principles). Six (6) of the remaining 12 hours must be at the 3000/4000 level. In special circumstances the undergraduate adviser may approve alternatives to the courses listed above. Students may not take P/NC in major or related courses (with the exception of ANTH 2000/4000).

Honors in Anthropology

Qualified juniors and seniors may apply to work for honors in anthropology:

A. Admission

- 3.3 minimum GPA in anthropology courses and 3.0 minimum cumulative GPA
- 12 hours completed work in anthropology
- Qualification as an anthropology major

B. Requirements

A student must complete 9 hours of independent work in anthropology. During the final quarter before graduation, the student must pass a comprehensive examination or submit a completed honors thesis. Students should discuss their special interests with faculty members or with the academic advisor, who will help identify an appropriate faculty member to guide the honors work.
