
Program Introduction

The Intensive English Summer/Winter Camp is a short-term cultural experience program hosted by the Center for International Studies and Programs at the University of Toledo. It is developed for international students who seek exposure to American social and academic cultures. Participation in this program will help students improve their communicative English skills, make friends with peers from the United States, and enhance their knowledge of American social and college culture.









Program Highlights

- ➤ Customized program length, content, and concentration based on group needs;

Sample Program Schedule 2 – for visual art majored student population

Week Days	Morning	 Intensive English Training (speaking, listening, reading and writing) Professors in the visual art department to give lecture on sculpture, ceramics, digital interactive media, photography, etc. Use of campus resources (gym, library, computer labs, etc.)
	Afternoon	 Trips to local attractions (amusement parks, museums, sport events, restaurants, field trips, etc.)
Weekend	Trips to nearby cities such as Chicago, New York, or Washington D.C.	➤ Sight-seeing in the city (Prices may increase based on the destination)
