In compliance with the "Timely Warning" provisions of the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998, the University Police are giving notice of a report of an attempted robbery/motor vehicle theft.

## SYNOPSIS:

The University of Toledo Police Department is investigating an attempted robbery and motor vehicle theft reported to have occurred in lot 19 at 9:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 25th, 2016 in lot 19. The male victim indicates while going to his car, he was approached by an unknown male who displayed a firearm and demanded the victim's automobile. The victim did not cooperate, and the suspect responded by discharging from the firearm one round into the ground and fleeing in a waiting vehicle. At least one other suspect was believed to be in the fleeing vehicle. The suspect(s) did not steal the victim's vehicle.
