Subject: Timely Warning Motor Vehicle Theft

In compliance with the "Timely Warning" provisions of the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998 the University Police are giving notice of a report of a motor vehicle theft.

Please note, Timely Warnings are advisories distributed via email and will not include a text message version. UT Alert text messages are reserved for active emergencies.

SYNOPSIS:

The University of Toledo Police Department is investigating a motor vehicle theft of a contractor's van in lot 44E on the Health Science Campus. The vehicle owner reported the vehicle was likely left unlocked and the key fob was likely located inside the vehicle. There have been several recent incidents of motor vehicle theft on the Health Science Campus with a similar theme: all vehicles were left unlocked with keys inside.

When: Determined through investigation to be taken approximately 1:15 p.m. on Saturday, Aug. 11 (reported to UTPD Monday, Aug 13th at 10:30 am).

Where: Lot 44e on the Health Science Campus

Injuries: no

Vehicle: 2007, Ford Econoline 350 van, white in color. License plate Ohio PGA 8749

Please be sure to lock your vehicle and do not leave keys inside vehicle.
