Subject: Timely Warning Robbery

In compliance with the "Timely Warning" provisions of the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998 the University Police are giving notice of a report of a robbery.

SYNOPSIS:

The University of Toledo Police Department is investigating a robbery at the RADISSON HOTEL at 3:18 a.m. One unknown suspect entered the hotel, placed his hand inside his hooded sweatshirt pushing forward an object that was in the shape of a handgun. The suspect then demanded money from the hotel clerk. After a short verbal exchange the suspect exited the hotel and fled the area without any money.
