In compliance with the "Timely Warning" provisions of the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998 the University Police are giving notice of a series of catalytic converter thefts on campus.

Please note, Timely Warnings are advisories distributed via email and will not include a text message version. UT Alert text messages are reserved for active emergencies.

SYNOPSIS:

A catalytic converter is an exhaust emission control device found on automobiles. The University of Toledo Police Department is investigating a series of catalytic converter thefts occurring on campus during the late evening or early morning hours. In this academic year thefts have been reported in parking areas 25, 26 and area 13. Please be extra vigilant by reporting any suspicious behavior including the appearance of mechanical work to parked cars to the University of Toledo Police Department. There are some things you can do to help prevent or reduce the likelihood of catalytic converter theft, but reporting suspicious behavior is the most important.

Security devices are available that attach to the converter, making it harder to steal. Having the converter welded in place also makes it more difficult to remove. If you have a security system on your car, calibrate it so vibration sets it off. This ensures the alarm activates if a thief tries to saw off the converter. Engrave your VIN number onto your catalytic converter to make it easier to identify in case it does get stolen.
