

## UTILITY SYSTEMS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF TOLEDO

- UTILITY SYSTEMS are defined as:
  - Water
  - Electrical Power
  - Steam (Heat)
  - Plumbing
  - Natural Gas
  - Sewer Systems
  - Telephones
  - Medical Gases
  - Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning
- Most utility systems on campus are “redundant”; this means there are secondary, back-up systems in place in the event the main system fails. For example, there are water main pipelines coming onto campus from both Arlington Avenue and Glendale Avenue.
- The Facilities Maintenance Department is responsible for maintaining utility systems in working order.
- To report any interruptions in utility systems, **call extension 5353 (HSC)** (Facilities Maintenance Work Control) **OR X1000 (MC)** (Plant Ops) which is the 24 hour **EMERGENCY** number to report any problems with water, electrical power or other utility.
- On the nursing floors, you can also refer to the “Red Book” to gather more information regarding the utilities at the UT Medical Center.
