Below are the March post-meeting agenda notes.

### Committee Updates

- Committee members are highly encouraged to bring forth agenda items as they are needed. ### Agenda Items

- **QuickTrach (Teleflex):** Kristin Calkins and Renee Stuart from Trauma requested a QuickTrach to assist the Trauma team for emergency Tracheostomies. Dr. Sheppard attended the meeting and provided clinical insight into the use and benefits of the product. Current procedures require the surgical scalpel Bougie Technique which can lead to more bleeding and requires more direct dissection. The QuickTrach is an all-in-one kit offloads cognitive steps in high stress events. The Nursing CVA Team **APPROVED** the use of the kit at UTMC.

#### Action Items:

- Tyler to add QuickTrach information to build form to get it skued for ordering by the trauma team at their convenience. Tyler to send pictures to staff education for infobytes messaging.
- **Pressure Infusion Bags:** Airlife is on Vizient Commit and has new pressure bags. Samples were brought in and the Nursing CVA Team **APPROVED** the use of the new Airlife bags. Samples of Medline pressure infusion bags were also reviewed; the committee preferred the Airlife but agreed that the Medline could be used as a substitute if needed.

#### Action Items:

- Tyler to work with purchasing and supply chain to sku new pressure infusion bags. Tyler to send pictures to staff education for infobytes messaging.

- **Diagnostic Procedure Trays Non-Thoracic:** Cardinal holds a Vizient Commit contract for Diagnostic Procedure Trays Non-Thoracic. Samples were brought in from both Cardinal and Medline. Both were reviewed and both were deemed acceptable by the committee. The Nursing CVA Team **APPROVED** the use of the new trays either from Cardinal or Medline.

- Tyler to work with purchasing and supply chain to sku the new trays. Tyler to send pictures to staff education for infobytes messaging.
