Open Doors 2016 Highlights

- ✓ International Students in U.S. Top One Million for the First Time
- ✓ More than a third of these international students studied engineering, math or computer science
- ✓ Strong growth among students in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math)
- ✓ Students from China and India remained the leading countries of origin and accounted for 84 percent of the growth in international students in 2015-16

 - 437 students participate in Optional Practical Training for up to three years. A benefit of F-1 status and mandated by U.S. Immigration & Customs Enforcement







- \$200 fee paid to OISSS to pay for the \$3,982 bi-annual redesignation fee, printing of government forms, required J-1 orientation, and program handbook.
- Annual total approximately \$10,000





- Read the literature, develop and test hypotheses, learn new techniques, conduct experiments and simulations, collect and analyze data and results
- Present and publish research results

Last semester

- Finish project/thesis dissertation document
- Thesis/dissertation defense (Notice of Thesis/Project)

Progress toward degree

- Plan of Study completed and planned coursework and research hours needed to complete your program
 - Work with your advisor or graduate program director
 - Must be on file by the end of your second semester
 - Modified plan of study can be submitted if courses change
- GRAD form submitted after you have developed a research topic, but before you begin your research.
 - Approvals for human subjects, animals, biologicals, radiation
 - Committee members



Progress toward degree

- Qualifying exam, proposal defense department checks for comprehension of coursework, soundness of research plan
- Thesis/dissertation defense announcement

Funding for graduate school

- Tuition scholarship (TS)
 - Covers only tuition, not fees
 - Courses must be on your plan of study
 - Must earn a C or better
 - Cannot be used for audited or undergraduate-level courses
 - Register early; pay fees before the 1st day of classes to avoid late payment fee
 - Notify your department if TS is not on your account by Sept. 30

Funding for graduate school

- Full time student status
 - 9 cr hr in Fall/Spring; 6 cr hr in Summer semester
- Teaching assistantship (TA) or stipend
 - TA funding includes tuition scholarship
 - Supports the teaching needs of the department or program
 - Mandatory TA training is August 23
- Research assistantship (RA) funded research project
 - Usually after first year is completed



Instrumentation Assistantship (Fall 2019)

- Open to all doctoral students in the college
- Recipients work 20 hours/week at the Center for Materials and Sensor Characterization (CMSC) in the College of Engineering under the supervision of the Center Director
- 3 years of funding
