#### **Course Description:**

This course addresses the processes of assessment, planning, implementation & evaluation of recreation therapy services

#### **Course Purpose:**

The purpose of this course is to introduce the student to the medical aspects relating to impairments and their implications for therapeutic recreation practice in the 21<sup>st</sup> century

#### **Course Objective:**

Upon completion of this course a student will demonstrate, at minimum, an understanding of, and an ability to apply, the professional competencies detailed below. Attainment of this objective will be evidenced by a student demonstrating, at minimum, an accumulated score of 85% (B) in the course.

#### Additional course objectives

- 1. To provide the student with a thorough knowledge of the assessment process in recreation therapy.
- 2. To increase the students awareness and understanding of a variety of assessment tools used in recreation therapy.
- 3. To assist the student to develop the knowledge, skills, and abilities to assist in the transition from assessment to practice.
- 4. To increase the students' knowledge in the field of therapeutic recreation service delivery including interventions, documentation, report writing and discharge planning all based on sound assessment principles.
- 5. To increase the students' ability to write assessment reports and develop treatment plans based upon formal and informal assessments.
