Program Development Process


- Discuss program concept with your dean and department chair
- Complete Program Concept Form
 - Form submission triggers an email to the Sr. Vice Provost of Academic Affairs for action.
- The University will need local governance approval before state approval.
- Additional steps are outlined for undergraduate and graduate programs.

Program Development Process

Process for inactivating (not accepting majors) a program.

- Colleges wishing to suspend a program that is no longer accepting students need to submit an "inactivate" proposal in the CIM (curriculum inventory management).
- As the CIM proposals passes through a shortened workflow, the Provost's Office will notify the state of the suspended program.

Processes outside of CIM with no signature


Processes in CIM that generate electronic signatures.

Program Design Institute

The Program Design Institute is invitational and is but one step in the broader Program Development Process.

The purpose of the Program Design Institute is to provide faculty groups with the resources to create student learning outcomes at the program and course level that align with Institutional Learning Outcomes, strategies for assessing them, and usable curriculum maps.





Program Design Institute

1. Define program learning outcomes and differentiate them from similar programs
2. Align those with ISLOs
3. Map courses to learning outcomes
4. Identify assessments





Program Design Institute

5. Meet with Finance and Administration to discuss financial viability, and begin paperwork for submission for new degree program
