University Assessment Committee: Defining "Co-Curricular"

Co-curricular programs are intentionally designed learning opportunities sponsored by the University of Toledo that fall outside of the scope of a specific academic program or course. They are purposefully aligned to, and support student development in, one or more of the institutional student learning outcomes (ISLO).

Each academic program and service unit that offers cocurricular programming is responsible for: (a) determining the program's alignment with the ISLOs; and (b) assessing and reporting the program's impact on students' learning.



"Co-Curricular" Examples

ISLO	Co-Curricular Program	Program SLO	Assessment Measure
Intellectual Skills	Undergraduate Research	Students practice critical thinking skills.	Undergraduate Research Fair poster presentation, judged by standardized rubric
Civic and Global Learning	Study Abroad	Students compare diverse views and perspectives.	Reflection paper rubric
Applied and Collaborative Learning	Student Employment	Students practice collaboration skills.	Supervisor evaluation
