- **Reserve your seat:** Once you're accepted into the program, your spot is guaranteed as long as you maintain the admissions criteria. No worrying about competing for a limited number of seats — your future is secure. Admission criteria include a bachelor's degree in any field of study with a minimum 3.0 GPA and a grade of B- or better in all prerequisite courses, including:
 - Introductory Biology, Heidelberg Equivalent: BIO 123 and BIO 123L
 - Human Anatomy and Physiology I and II, Heidelberg Equivalent: BIO 363 and BIO 364
 - Introduction to Psychology, Heidelberg Equivalent: PSY 101
 - Abnormal Psychology, Heidelberg Equivalent: PSY 209
 - Introduction to Sociology or Anthropology, Heidelberg Equivalent: SOC 100
 - Medical Terminology, Heidelberg Equivalent: HSC 150
 - Statistics, Heidelberg Equivalent: MTH 119
 - Lifespan Human Development, Heidelberg Equivalent: PSY 205

Finish the doctoral program in as little as three years. The program includes 95 credit hours and integrated fieldwork each semester. Complete a research project and individualized capstone project before graduation.
