Admission criteria include, a bachelor's degree in any field of study with a minimum 3.0 GPA and a grade of B- or better in all prerequisite courses, including:
 - Introductory Biology, Kent State Equivalent: BSCI 10120
 - Human Anatomy and Physiology I and II, Kent State Equivalent: BSCI 21010 and BSCI 21020 or *ATTR 25057 and *ATTR 25058 or EXSC 25057 and EXSC 25058
 - Introduction to Psychology, Kent State Equivalent: PSYC 11762
 - Abnormal Psychology, Kent State Equivalent: PSYC 40111
 - Introduction to Sociology or Anthropology, Kent State Equivalent: SOC 12050 or ANTH 18210
 - Medical Terminology, Kent State Equivalent: HED 14020
 - Statistics, Kent State Equivalent: MATH 10041 or MATH 30011
 - Lifespan Human Development, Kent State Equivalent: NURS 20950 or PESP 25033

Finish the doctoral program in as little as three years. The program includes 95 credit hours and integrated fieldwork each semester. Complete a research project and individualized capstone project before graduation.
