Policy on Curricular Satisfactory Progress to the Honors Medallion

This policy aims to distinguish students on curricular track to earn the Jesup Scott Honors College medallion from those not making sufficient progress yet who still enjoy priority registration, access to JSHC scholarships, and the suite of other Honors benefits. Progress here is measured by earned Honors credits and taken core “HON” courses. Students not meeting the satisfactory guidelines below established by their degree-granting college will lose their Honors coding and attending benefits. A curricular progress check will happen each Summer by July 1st. Those not in good-standing will be notified of their status by the JSHC and given two weeks to develop a remediation plan in consultation with their [College Honors Director](#), who can allow them to remain in Honors with an approved plan. Those who do not create an approved remediation plan will then be decoded from the JSHC. Goals established for a student’s “first year” or later years are measured from when the student began at UToledo as an undergraduate and are not affected by AP, CCP, or transfer credits. Courses taken in the Summer term as the check is performed will factor into that review.

***Note:** For students with two or more majors or who are earning two degrees in different degree-granting colleges, you will only need to satisfy the requirements below for whichever college wherein you plan to earn College Honors.

College of Arts and Letters

(Blue track baseline: HON 1010, HON 2010 / 2020 / 2030, and HON 3010 OR HON 4950/4960 required)

- Honors students must complete HON 1010, along with *at least one* of the following by the end of their second year: HON 2010, HON 2020, or HON 2030.
- Honors students must complete at least 6 additional credits of Honors coursework from any department by the end of their second year.
- Honors students must complete at least one section of departmental Honors research by the end of the fall semester of their fourth year.

College of Business and Innovation

(Blue track baseline: HON 1010, HON 2010, and HON 3010 required)

- Honors students must complete HON 1010 by the end of their first year, HON 2010 by the end of their second year, and HON 3010 by the end of their fourth year.
- Honors students must then take *any six of the following seven courses for Honors credit* by the end of the below stipulated year:
 - BUAD 1010 in the first year
 - BUAD 2040 in the second year
 - BUAD 3010, BUAD 3020, BUAD 3030, or BUAD 3040 in the third year
 - BUAD 4020 by the end of the fourth year.

Judith Herb College of Education

(Blue track baseline: HON 1010, HON 2010, and HON 3010 required)

- It is advisable that Honors students complete HON 1010, HON 2010, and HON 3010 by the end of their second year.
- Honors students should complete their 27 required Honors credits by the end of their third year. *To be on track to do so, they must complete 15 Honors credits by the end of their second year.* Otherwise, they may be dropped from the JSHC.
- If a student has completed less than 15 but at least 12 Honors credits by the end of their second year and is interested in earning the JSHC medallion, they must make an appointment with the JHCOE Honors Director to discuss the possibility of graduating with College Honors. At that meeting, the student must have a written plan detailing how they plan to complete the remainder of their Honors credits by the end of their third year. If the Director finds the plan satisfactory, s/he may allow the student to continue towards the medallion. However, if by the end of the following semester (i.e., the first semester of the third year) the student has not made satisfactory progress toward completing the courses set forth in the plan, their Honors coding will be dropped.

College of Engineering

(Blue track baseline: HON 1010, HON 2010, and HON 3010 required)

- Honors students must complete HON 1010 by the end of their second year.
- Honors students must complete HON 2010 by the end of their third year.
- Honors students must have earned at least 6 credits of Honors coursework by the end of their first year, at least 12 Honors credits by the end of their second year, and at least 18 Honors credits by the end of their junior year.

College of Health and Human Services

(Blue track baseline: HON 1010, HON 2010, and HON 3010 required)

- Honors students must complete HON 1010 and HON 2010 by the end of their second year.
 - Students who have not completed HON 1010 by this point will have their Honors coding dropped.
 - Students who have completed HON 1010 but not HON 2010 by this point are required to meet with the HHS Honors Director to determine their status.

College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics

(Blue track baseline: HON 1010, HON 2010 / 2020 / 2030, and HON 3010 OR HON 4950/4960 required)

- Honors students must complete HON 1010, along with *at least one* of the following by the end of their second year: HON 2010, HON 2020, or HON 2030.
- Honors students must complete at least 6 additional credits of Honors coursework from any department by the end of their second year.
- Honors students must complete at least one section of departmental Honors research by the end of the fall semester of their fourth year.

College of Nursing

(Blue track baseline: HON 1010, HON 2010, and HON 3010 OR HON 4950/4960 required)

- Honors students must complete HON 1010 by the end of their first year.
- Honors students must complete HON 2010 and HON 3010 OR HON 4950/4960 by the end of their second year.

College of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences

(Blue track baseline: HON 1010, HON 2010, and HON 3010 required)

- Honors students must complete HON 1010 and HON 2010 *as well as* at least 6 additional Honors credits from any department by the end of their second year.
 - Students who have not completed HON 1010 and HON 2010 by the end of their second year will have their Honors coding dropped.
 - Students who have not completed at least 12 Honors credits by the end of their second year who wish to remain in the Honors College must meet with the CPPS Honors Advisor and/or Director during the fall semester to develop a plan for successful completion of College Honors.
- Honors students must complete at least one section of departmental Honors research by the end of the fall semester of their fourth year.

University College

(Blue track baseline: HON 1010, HON 2010 / 2020 / 2030, and HON 3010 OR HON 4950/4960 required)

- Honors students are advised to complete HON 1010 by the end of their first year. HON 1010 *must* be completed by the end of the second year, though, along with *at least one* of the following: HON 2010, HON 2020, or HON 2030.
- Honors students should complete at least 6 additional credits of Honors coursework from any department by the end of their second year.
 - Undecided students are beyond this encouraged to review the Honors requirements of any major(s) they are considering to have a sense of what other core Honors courses and college/department-specific requirements are needed to reach the 27 Honors credits and earn the medallion.
 - Individualized Degree Program and Liberal Studies students are beyond this advised to complete HON 3010 *or one* Honors seminar (HON 4950/4960) in their third or fourth year.
