CHECK DESIRED CLINIC OFFERING:

IMMIGRANT JUSTICE CLINIC

This clinic is a one-semester, (4) credit-hour course in which students are introduced to substantive law regarding the representation of noncitizens and the theory and practice of core lawyering skills, including interviewing; counseling; listening; investigating facts; researching and analyzing relevant law; case planning; developing a theory of the case; creative problem-solving; strategic decision-making; collaborating; legal storytelling; critical lawyering; administrative agency and courtroom practicing; and legal writing. Students work under the supervision of clinical faculty and will represent clients in the community. The class will meet twice a week, and students will be expected to complete readings for some class meetings. Students are required to keep six (6) hours of regularly scheduled office hours during the week between the hours of 8:30am and 5:00pm outside the regular class time.

ADVANCED IMMIGRANT JUSTICE CLINIC

The Advanced Clinic is a one semester, (2) credit-hour course in which students who have successfully completed and excelled in the regular Immigrant Justice Clinic will work more independently on their cases and may have some supervisory duties of basic Immigrant Justice Clinic students. There is no classroom component and only five (5) hours of regularly scheduled office hours during the week.

PLEASE NOTE: Enrollment in the clinic offerings is limited. Completion of Immigration Law is preferred but not required. Acceptance is determined by the clinical faculty on a case by case basis.
