


Continuum of Climate Mobility

- Migration predominantly voluntary (within and across borders)
- 2. Displacement predominantly forced movement (within and across borders)
- Planned relocation origin side to a destination, initiated by a state or community
- Immobile people in face of climate change trapped populations or immobile or unwilling to move.






Climate Migration – the numbers
