ABOUT THE PROGRAM


Ten years ago, the College of Law created the Legal Institute of the Great Lakes. Over the course of the past decade, the Institute has become a center for legal issues regarding the region. In addition to other activities, the Institute hosts an annual symposium and publishes the Great Lakes Law Journal. The College has recently decided to focus the Institute on the legal issues involved in the national fresh water supply crisis and its impact on the Great Lakes Watershed.

The issue of clean water will dominate the national political agenda for this century. As drought sweeps the nation and the worldwide demand for clean water increases exponentially, the need for a comprehensive understanding regarding water usage in the Great Lakes Watershed will correspondingly magnify. The legal and political implications of this reality must be examined closely before the lack of water crupts into a major national crisis.

The symposium will begin by examining Canadian perspectives on the regulation of Great Lakes water and the coordination of such controls with American authorities. The water rights of Native Americans and the significance of such claims for the Great Lakes region will be the focus of the second panel. Finally, an update regarding preliminary concepts for an interstate agreement for the Great Lakes will be analyzed in detail.
