Biographical Sketch

This collection contains materials related to the Paratshek family of Toledo. A brief outline of the family tree as known is outlined below.

- Teresa Dorothy Paratschek married Edward Andrew DeAngelo.
- Joseph Ralph Paratschek married Rachael Emigene Williams in 1933.
- Ralph Anthony Paratschek married Mary Theresa Kelly in 1934.
- Gwendolyn Paratschek married Lord Van Meter in 1938.

Scope and Content Note

The collection contains three scrapbooks, a flyer for a school performance from 1934, and a calendar from 1998.

Scrapbook #1 relates to Mary Kelly's life throughout college. Scrapbooks #2 and #3 are filled with pictures of the family as well as newspaper clippings of the Paratschek family.
