Schools. If the Faculty recommends to the Board that a college of Law be established it will be necessary to appoint one full time law teacher for next year.

It wasmoved, seconded and carried to adjourn.

Regular Meeting, Board of Directors, May 28,1934.

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the University was held on May 28,1934, at seven-thirty o'clock P.M. in the Board room with the following present: Mr.Dowd, Mr.Geleerd, Mr.Keller, Dr.McCormick, Mr.Price, President Nash, and Miss Mack, Clerk. In the absence of Mr.Mahon, President of the Board, Vice-President Dowd took the chair. There were also present at the meeting, Mr. E.R.Harrison, Engineer, representing Mr.L.A.Boulay, State Engineer

for PWA and Mr. Gerow, Architect.

President Nash reported that bids had been opened at noon for the new buildings. The low bidder was Henry M.Martens Company of Detroit, Michigan, with a total bid of \$245,800. Preliminary negotiations were entered into during the afternoon with this bidder to see what economies might be made. A careful re-checking of the whole project on the basis of this bid indicates that the cost to carry out the project without material cuts will be \$270,700. On motion made by Mr.Geleerd and seconded by Mr.Price that the President be authorized to ask the Government to increase the allotment to \$270,700,increasing the grant proportionately but that the bond issue of \$195,000 remain as now set, the vote stood as follows:
