RE: 3 Journalism Awards

Dean Leathers: I have spoken about this to you but feel it should be recorded, hence I am sending you this, and putting a copy of it in my files under "Awards":

1. Because capital had been used up in the Leo Steinem Award (by JRL) reducing it from \$1000.00 to little more than \$500.00, Paul Rieger, Comptroller, and I, agreed that henceforth the award would be for only \$25.00 each year instead of \$50.00 (which JRL had awarded and which, because the interest was not enough, ate away at the principle). At 5% interest, it means that this can go on for a good many years yet. This will commence at the 1969 Honors Day listings when we will list this for only \$25.00.

2. The same situation occurred in the handling of the William Hall award. Principle was used up, rather than interest, and Paul and I agreed that we would not touch this for a few years until it built up. As of 11/30/68, it had a balance of \$275.00. We will try to get it to \$300.00 before starting it into action again.

3. The Goldie A. Levy Journalism Award is for \$1000.00 and this is a restricted account from which \$50.00 will be paid each year. At 5% this can go on without the principle being touched.

I regret that the principle on the first two has been reduced, but I am sure you concur with the comptroller and me that this is the best way to handle these.

I hope, even under these conditions, that they will be listed in the catalogues of the future, as awards in journalism. By publicizing them, I hope we will draw more money to this program.

Gail Miller (1844 Strathmoor) was awarded \$25 from Alpha Phi Gamma, Journalism honorary, for her contributions to that organization.
