Acquisitions and Collection Management Librarian – Assistant Professor

The University Libraries at The University of Toledo (UToledo), which includes the William S. Carlson Library, the Raymon H. Mulford Health Science Library, and the Ward M. Canaday Center for Special Collections, invites applications for the position of Acquisitions and Collection Management Librarian. This position will be responsible for collection management of physical and electronic monograph formats for The University Libraries, coordinating the acquisition, assessment, selection, and maintenance of resources in all subject areas and for all library collections. Core duties will also include the management of general collection funds and endowments and the maintenance of the physical collection. This position will work closely within The University Libraries and with other campus units to develop, coordinate, and maintain collections and coordinate collections budgets for The University Libraries. This position is also responsible for liaison activities with one or more academic departments. These activities include outreach, research consultation, and collection development. In addition, this position has scholarship and service responsibilities required for fulfilling tenure standards of The University Libraries. These responsibilities include publications, presentations, and various levels of professional service.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Librarianship

- Provides leadership in the overall management of non-continuing physical and digital resource collections, including the coordination of selection, deselection, and other collection management projects.
- Coordinates monograph acquisitions, including supervision of staff who place orders, pay invoices, and receive shipments.
- Manages monograph collection budgets in coordination with the Electronic Resources Librarian and the Director of Collection Services.
- Oversees invoice processing for print and electronic acquisitions.
- Coordinates and guides the collections activities of subject librarians. Develops and implements training programs related to collection management.
- Assesses the collections and makes informed decisions based on data analysis in coordination with the Electronic Resources Librarian and the Director of Collection Services.
- Oversees the routine maintenance of and the overall management of the physical book collections, including the coordination of de-selection and shifting projects.
- Works with colleagues and other units in The University Libraries to promote the collections and collections-related activities.
- Establishes and maintains effective relationships with publishers and vendors in coordination with the Electronic Resources Librarian.
- Manages and provides stewardship for The University Libraries gifts and endowments related to collections. Evaluates inquiries about gifts-in-kind or donations for library collections.

- Cultivates a strong collaborative relationship with all library units that build and maintain digital and physical collections.
- Assists in compiling collection content and expenditure analyses for surveys and accreditation reports and annual unit assessment reports for the University's Office of Assessment.
- Maintains an awareness of the trends and issues affecting acquisitions and collection development and management.
- Serves as liaison to one or more academic departments with responsibility for outreach, instruction, research consultation, collection development, and development of learning materials.
- Develops and maintains library guides and other online self-directed learning materials for unit and outreach areas.
- Participates in reference services, including in-person, phone, chat reference, and oncall.
- Participates in projects, strategic planning, and other library-wide initiatives.
- Performs other related duties as assigned.

Research, Scholarship

- Develops an active research agenda to meet the requirements of tenure and promotion.
- Publishes peer-reviewed articles, presents at professional conferences, and produces other forms of scholarship.

Service

- Serves on library, college, and university committees.
- Serves the professional community.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- Master's Degree in Library and Information Science from an ALA accredited school or earned doctorate in a relevant field from an accredited university.
- Experience with collection management.
- Experience in several of the following areas: budgeting, finance, licensing, and procurement operations.
- Strong customer service focus.
- Demonstrated understanding and appreciation of diversity and the importance of inclusion as shown by a commitment to apply and incorporate the differences, complexities, and opportunities that diversity brings to an organization.
- Demonstrated potential to meet university and library criteria for tenure and promotion, including scholarly presentations and/or publications and service.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

- 3-5 years of experience in academic research libraries.
- Knowledge of scholarly communication and the research enterprise.
- Supervisory and managerial experience.

- Experience working in a consortial environment.
- Working knowledge of Innovative Interfaces' Sierra ILS, OCLC, and related systems.
