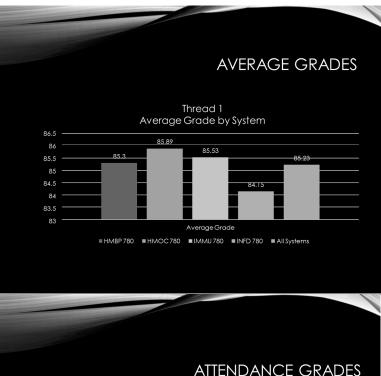

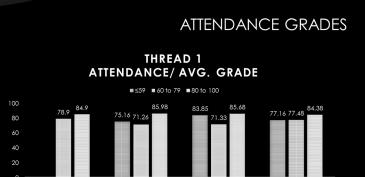

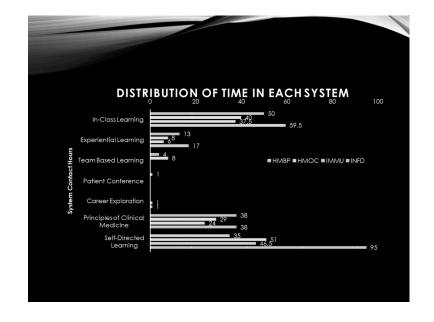

#### **Bylaws Committee**

#### **Elections Committee**

#### 1. Duties and Responsibilities:

- To prepare a slate of candidates for the offices of the Vice President and Secretary/Treasurer;
- To present the slate of candidates to the Executive Committee at its regular April meeting, and then to the Council at the May meeting.
- Nominate Chairs and Members to standing and ad hoc committees of the Council, with the advice and consent of the Executive Committee, followed by supervision of the election when indicated.

#### 2. Membership

The Elections Committee shall be chaired by the Secretary/Treasurer of the Council.

The Committee will consist of one Council Member from the clinical department and one from the basic science department. Members are appointed by the Secretary/Treasurer and approved by the Executive Committee.



#### **Faculty Affairs Committee**

## UT COMLS Academic Affairs Committee Report On Proposed University-Level Tenure and Promotion Guidelines

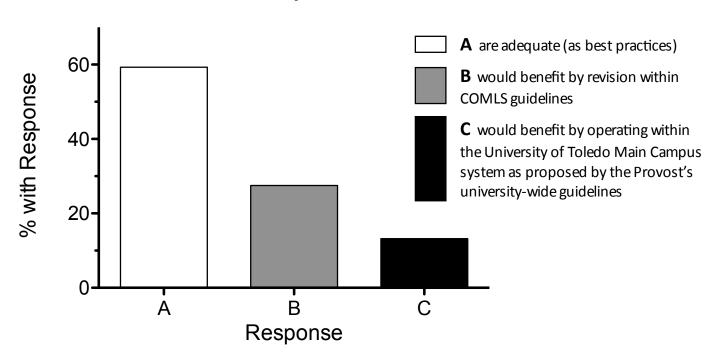
- Rationale for developing university-level tenure and promotion guidelines applicable to all tenure-track faculty at the University of Toledo from Andrew T. Hsu, Ph.D. Provost & Executive VP Academic Affairs:
- "Almost all public, comprehensive universities provide university-wide tenure and promotion guidelines, and the major higher education associations that define **best practices**, including the American Council of Education (ACE) and the American Association of University Professors (AAUP), expect such guidelines to exist.
- The University of Toledo does not currently have such campus-wide guidelines, which was
  often cited as a cause for errors, inconsistencies, and even confusion among faculty,
  departments, and colleges in the tenure and promotion process.
- University-level tenure and promotion guidelines establish greater continuity and consistency across the university, creating a more functional model of evaluation where departments, colleges, and upper administration are mutually supportive and share clear expectations.
- They protect faculty by stabilizing the tenure and promotion process across units, ensuring its timeliness and safeguarding candidates from the disruptions that may occur as the result of occasional error."

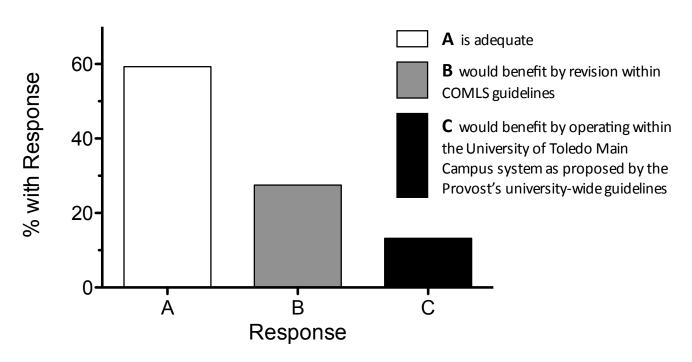

Do you feel that the current COMLS guidelines for tenure and promotion......



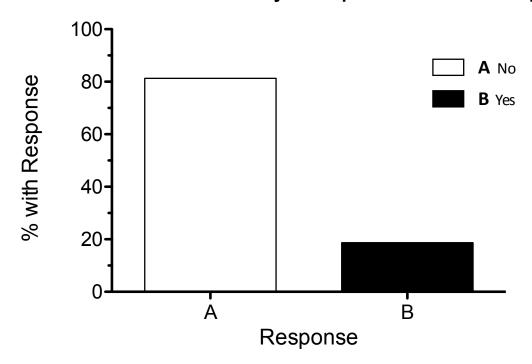
Question 2:

Under the current COMLS guidelinesfor tenure and promotion do you feel that faculty protection......



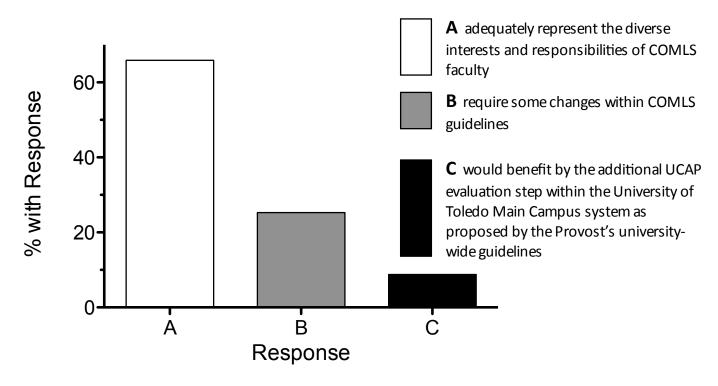

## Selected COMLS Faculty Comments Regarding Adoption of University-Level Tenure and Promotion Guidelines

- I believe the promotion and tenure process for medical faculty is already quite complex and is managed well within the medical campus. Introducing a University-level process may increase the complexity and potentially hamper it.
- Our tenure packets are reviewed by the Dept. promotions committee, by the Chair of the
  Dept, by the Promotions and tenure committee, and by the Dean, at least. The process
  seems fair and adequate scrutiny is given to the applications as would be expected for an
  academic institution. In addition, it is unfortunate that faculty will only be able to apply for
  promotion and/or tenure once a year.
- I think the UCAP process is not relevant to the COMLS. Utilizing such a process will
  further reduce faculty satisfaction with the University and will lead to mass exodus of valued
  faculty. This is not a positive development and has increased stress for faculty within COMLS.
  We are not unionized and should not be subjected to this unnecessary change. With due
  respect the main campus has no expertise or capacity to recommend or deny promotion.
- First of all, many or most of the main campus faculty have no clue as to how medical faculty members, certainly those in the clinician role, work or relate to teaching.
   Second, the medical faculty is not unionized and so procedures cannot be blended with the main campus faculty that is.
- Why is there only one review per year instead of the 2 cycle system which has served us well?
- ✓ Should establish some kind of scoring system based on specific track instead of subjectively judged by opinions from individual reviewers.

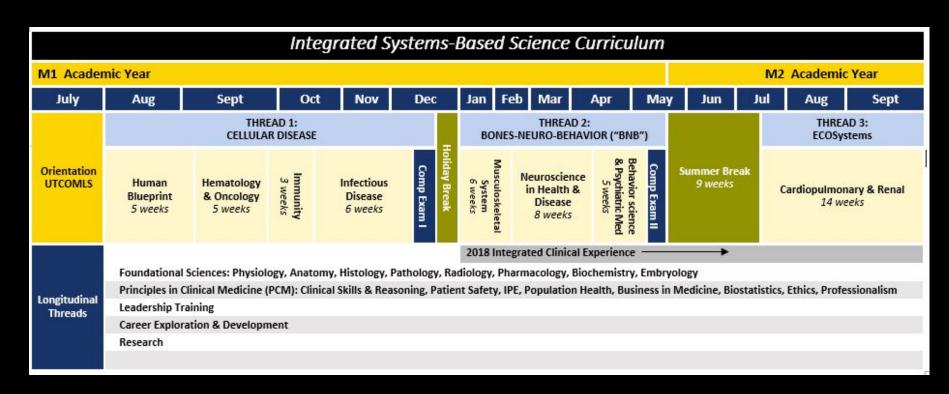

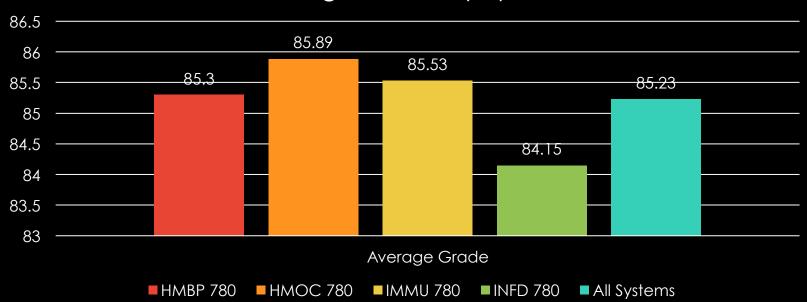
# THREAD 1 CELLULAR DISEASE PERFORMANCE

### REDESIGNED UTCOM CURRICULUM

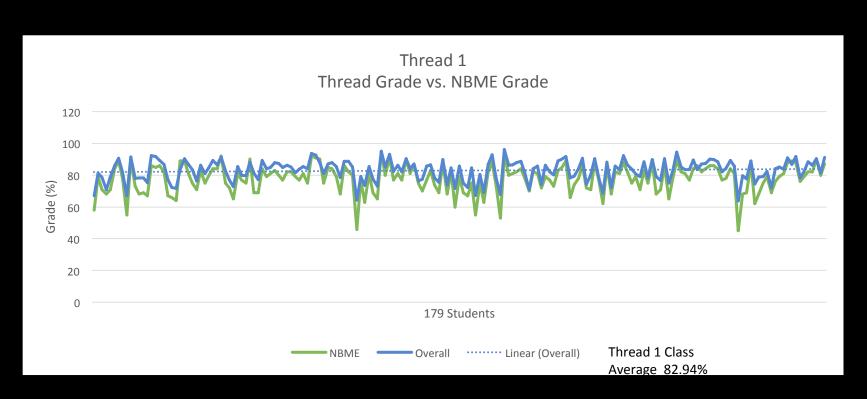


## **AVERAGE GRADES**
