## TRAINING SITES

### All training sites are within 20 minutes of each other

### Toledo Veterans Affairs Clinic, VA Ann Arbor's Healthcare System's Community Based Outpatient Clinic

The Toledo VA Outpatient Clinic serves 8 Ohio counties as well as Southeastern Michigan. Residents rotate here for one month for Outpatient Internal Medicine during PGY1 year.



### Northwest Ohio Psychiatric Hospital

NOPH is one of the 6 inpatient state psychiatric facilities overseen by the Ohio Department of Mental Health & Addiction Services, serving northwest Ohio's 23 counties. It has a capacity of 114 beds, and serves both civil



and forensic adult patients, such as those who have been found incompetent to stand trial or not guilty by reason of insanity. -

### ProMedica Flower Hospital, A Division of ProMedica Toledo Hospital

Residents rotate through Flower Hospital, a private hospital in Sylvania, Ohio, for their inpatient adult psychiatry rotations for several months. Another rotation is one month of Emergency medicine

during PGY1 year. Residents also rotate here for their Emergency Psychiatry rotation, split between Flower Hospital and Rescue Mental Health & Addiction Services, during PGY2 year.

ProMedica Toledo Hospital is a 794-bed public hospital in Toledo, Ohio that is part of the ProMedica Health System. This level I trauma center is the largest acute care hospital in the area. Psychiatry residents rotate through Toledo Hospital for IM, neurology, and electives.




## TRAINING SITES

UTMC is a 246-bed hospital with services in orthopedics, sports medicine, family medicine, internal medicine, surgery, and emergency medicine.

SBH is an 18-bed unit for geriatric patients ages 55 and older, requring inpatient psychiatric hospitalization. Diagnoses include disorders of mood, anxiety, psychosis, neurocognition, and more.

# CLINICAL CURRICULUM: ZEPF PGY 3 YEAR



The majority of PGY3 is spent on the UT Health Science Campus, in the Ruppert Health Center.

Outpatient services are provided via telepsychiatry in addition to traditional in-office visits.

The resident clinic treats patients who have a variety of diagnoses and payor sources, with an array of treatment modalities, including psychotherapy, clozapine, and long acting injectables.

## MOONLIGHTING

### **Moonlighting allowed PGY3 year**

For those residents that are interested and meet qualifications, moonlighting can occur during PGY3 year and later. Some common moonlighting settings include local community mental health centers, & inpatient units.



## CENTER

**Residents** spend 1/2 day weekly for 2-4 months with Assertive severe & persistent mental illnesses.



## UNISON

Residents spend 1/2 day weekly for 2-4 months with the forensic ACT Team, working with Victoria Kelly MD, treating patients on conditional release who have been found not guilty by reason of insanity.

### PG-2 Year **General Psychiatry**

Additional CAP inpatient months compared to general residency peers, and longitudinal CAP outpatient clinic. There are also possible opportunities for CAP electives.



### PG-3 Year **General Psychiatry**

Complete the fast-tracked general residency program, for the 12 month longitudinal adult continuity outpatient clinic, with 1/2 day to maintain as CAP clinic.



### PG-4 Year **CAP Fellowship Year 1**

Inpatient CAP unit at UTMC Kobacker, Emergency psychiatry, in addition to outpatient clinic at UTMC and a community mental health center. Sent to conferences.

• Opportunity to work with CAP patients for 2-4 years

• Present noon conferences with general residency



### PG-5 Year **CAP Fellowship Year 2**

Outpatient services at UTMC Ruppert and a community mental health clinic, pediatric neurology, schools, increased integration with child psychologists, and more. Sent to conferences.



In addition to the atmosphere that fosters growth and resiliency, residents regularly participate in wellness programming.









# HOW TO APPLY

## **General Psychiatry Residency Application Requirements**

- There are 4-5 spots open for up-• coming PGY1 class (which are 3-4 categorical & 1 child track)
- Completed applications in ERAS must be received no later than November 30th.
- Personal Statement
- 3 Letters of recommendation, and each must be written by US physi- • cians and dated within the past 12 months

- Dean's letter of MSPE
- US Citizenship, or J1 visa sponsorship
- Official medical school transcript
- Preference given to passing USMLE Step 1, or COMLEX Level 1 on first attempt
- Preference given to USMLE Step 2CK scores of 225 or greater, or COMLEX Level 2CE scores of 425 or greater
- If FMG applicant, preference given to USMLE Step 3 pass on first attempt
- Signals accepted

Interviews will all occur virtually, from November through mid-December. We use the Thalamus platform. If you are extended an invitation and accept, you will be able to go to a virtual event with the residents the Sunday before your interview day. You will then meet with various faculty during your scheduled day, receive a virtual tour, and that will mark the conclusion of the interview day.
