<u>Elective Description/ Requirements:</u>	The student will have the opportunity to learn different techniques for examining the eye. The student will evaluate patients with eye disorders in an outpatient setting. Students will see evaluate patients with diabetic retinopathy, macular degeneration, cataract and glaucoma. Each acting intern must complete two on-line modules to prepare the acting intern for his/her role as a teacher or junior medical student.
<u>Length of Clerkship:</u>	4 weeks
<u>Links to EPOs</u>	<u>Educational Course Objectives:</u> At the end of the rotation the student will be able to: 1. Demonstrate and document the ability to perform and adequate eye examination, including the fundamentals of slit lamp and dilated fundus exam. 2. Evaluate and diagnose common ophthalmic disorders. 3. Distinguish the relationship of ocular manifestations and systemic disease. 4. Establish treatment options for basic ophthalmic disease entities. 5. Management of ophthalmic disease in the pediatric and adult patient. 6. Management and treatment of emergent ophthalmic disorders. 7. Differentiate what conditions may be safely handled in a general practice vs. those which need to be referred to an ophthalmic specialist.

<u>Instructional Methods:</u>	1. Observation of patient examination in a clinic setting. 2. Supervised examination of ophthalmic patients. 3. Small group discussion. 4. Case studies. 5. Review of tests including interpretation. 6. Observation of ophthalmic surgery including review of charts and indications for surgical intervention.
<u>Evaluation methods employed:</u>	1. Clinical competency evaluations 2. Faculty/Resident observation 3. Professional assessments 4. Attendance 5. Case write up
<u>Prerequisites:</u>	Successful completion of Yrs. 1 & 2, and a passing score on USMLE Step 1.
