In addition, the student will participate in neonatal resuscitation by attending deliveries of high-risk newborns.

Demonstrate and apply the knowledge of the pathophysiology of common problems seen in the neonate, particularly those of cardio-respiratory nature in management of neonatal patients.</li> <li>2. Analyze medical problems and use previously acquired knowledge to synthesize and appropriate differential diagnosis.</li> <li>3. Evaluate the progress of the team's management decisions and discuss appropriate adjustments to the care of the patient.</li> <li>4. Demonstrate a commitment to learning about issues unique to newborns requiring intensive care management.</li> <li>5. Perform procedures under direct supervision of attending physician. These procedures may include insertion of umbilical catheters, lumbar puncture, endotracheal intubation, neonatal resuscitation, and arterial and venipuncture.</li> </ol>
