<b><u>Elective Description</u></b>	Student will have the opportunity to participate in the field of high-risk obstetrics. The student will be integrated in to the high risk obstetrics service as an acting intern on the team and will be involved with outpatient clinics, inpatient care, and surgery. The student will be exposed to all areas of obstetrics, including labor and delivery, outpatient clinic at CHS providing antenatal care of mother and fetus, intrapartum management and deliveries and postpartum follow-up.

Demonstrate proficiency in obtaining a complete obstetrics and gynecology history and physical with implementation of a plan.</li> <li>2. Understand referrals and consultations. Understand outpatient treatment and follow up with obstetric conditions.</li> <li>3. Interpret the significance of history, physical findings, lab data, and imaging studies of various obstetric conditions.</li> <li>4. Write complete progress notes and be able to present succinctly and discuss in the clinical setting.</li> <li>5. Observe and understand basic anatomy, physiology and co-relation of medical conditions within an obstetric context.</li> <li>6. Understand basic principles of prenatal care and antenatal surveillance.</li> <li>7. Perform basic obstetric examinations, including assessment of the fetus, maternal physical exam and interpretation of sonographic data. The student will function at the level of an intern. This will include admission history and physical exam, diagnostic plan, differential diagnosis, treatment plan and follow up and discharge planning.</li> </ol>

Daily office patients with teaching</li> <li>3. Intraoperative instruction</li> <li>4. Interpretation of lab data</li> <li>5. Diagnostic tests – use/interpretation</li> <li>6. Case studies</li> <li>7. Inpatient teaching rounds</li> </ol>
<b><u>Evaluation methods:</u></b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Faculty observation will be done by obstetric attending, senior resident (Clinic chief) and nursing staff</li> <li>2. Oral presentation on high risk obstetric topic at the end of the rotation.</li> </ol>
