Elective Description/ Requirements: Designed for students pursuing Otolaryngology residency. This clerkship is designed to expose medical students to common ear, nose and throat problems such as recurrent tonsillitis, otitis media, hearing loss, swallowing problems, hoarseness, dizziness, chronic ear disease, sinusitis, maxilla facial trauma, snoring, sleep apnea, and head and neck cancer. Will spend time in Audiology, have a reading list and be expected to give a 15-20 minute presentation.
