The rotation is based in the hospital-based orthopaedic clinic, the operating room, and the inpatient hospital. This elective is structured to students' requests as availability allows. An ambulatory experience is available for those students not particularly interested in the operating room experience and is best suited for those students with an interest in primary care. For those students interested in the operating room, the student is expected to function as a first or second assistant in most cases.
