Elective Description / Requirements:	This is an introductory, structured clinical experience under direct supervision designed to provide the student with experience diagnosing, treating, and caring for patients with allergies and immunologic disorders. Because of the high prevalence of allergic disorders among the general population, this elective should be of considerable practical value to the student planning a career in primary care (Medicine, Pediatrics, Family Medicine) and select specialties (e.g., Dermatology and Otolaryngology).
