Elective Description/ Requirements:

This elective consists of a mixture of inpatient consultation and outpatient experiences. The student will have primary and/or consultative responsibility for patients who have a variety of acid-base and electrolyte disorders and problems in clinical nephrology and renal transplantation. Students will be responsible for evaluating patients and formulating a plan of

care, which will then be presented, to faculty. House officers may or may not be on the rotation. Topics discussed during the rotation will include: fluids and electrolytes, acid-base problems, hypertension, nephrolithiasis, acute renal failure, chronic renal failure, glomerular diseases, interstitial diseases, dialysis, and transplant.
