Demonstrate and document the ability to perform an adequate eye examination, including the fundamentals of slit lamp and dilated fundus exam. 2. Evaluate and diagnose common ophthalmic disorders. 3. Distinguish the relationship of ocular manifestations and systemic disease. 4. Establish treatment options for basic ophthalmic disease entities. 5. Manage ophthalmic disease in the pediatric and adult patient. 6. Manage and treat emergent ophthalmic disorders. 7. Differentiate what conditions may be safely handled in a general practice vs. those which need to be referred to an ophthalmic specialist.
