<u>Elective Description/ Requirements:</u>	This clerkship is designed to expose students to a variety of urological disorders, primarily in outpatient office setting. Teaching is conducted in preceptor's office and in and outpatient operating rooms, transplant clinic as well as organ procurement and on outpatient rounds. Patients may present with a variety of disorders including but not limited to voiding problems, urinary tract pain, impotence, erectile dysfunction, renal failure.

Display ability to assist in urologic diagnostic instrumentation and common urologic operations, including ability to catheterize the bladder</li> <li>7. Demonstrate understanding of appropriate urologic care by the primary care physician and disorders requiring referral to a Urologist and placement on a transplant list.</li> <li>8.
