Students spend time in UTMC Sports Medicine Clinic, Family Medicine Clinic, Orthopedic Clinic with the option of private orthopedics office. Students will also spend time with sports oriented physical therapists, athletic trainers, and exercise physiologists. Students may also attend high school and college athletic contests and community sporting events as they are available.
