<u>Elective Description/ Requirements:</u>	The special topics in Health Care Administration provides an opportunity for the MD/MBA student to complete an independent project on a topic of their interest (topic must be approved by course director). Students will be required to complete both an oral presentation and a summary written paper regarding the project. Students will also be required to meet weekly with Dr. Mohamad to discuss project progress as well as discuss assigned readings in the book "Why Hospitals Should Fly: The Ultimate Flight Plan to Patient Safety and Quality Care" by John Nance, JD. Additionally, the student will have mentoring experiences in hospital administration with UTMC leadership that includes Chief Executive Office, Chief Operating and Clinical Officer, Vice President of Patient Care Services, Director of Operative Services, Hospital Administrator and Director of the Cancer Center, Associate Vice-President, Chief Administrative Officer for Quality and Safety, Finance Officer, Senior Associate Dean of Clinical Affairs, Administrator for Hospital Development, Legal Counsel, and Compliance officer. Organizational financial statements (income statements, balance sheets) will also be reviewed.
<u>Length of Clerkship:</u>	4 weeks
