DR. NINA I. MCCLELLAND, 1929-2020

Dr. McClelland's passion began with her first job as a chemist and bacteriologist in the Department of Health at the Wastewater Reclamation Facility in the city of Toledo. She became the first woman in Ohio to earn a Class A license for wastewater treatment.

She later served on committees for the U.S. Department of Commerce, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and National Academy of Sciences' National Research Council. Dr. McClelland was also chair of the Board of Directors for the American Chemical Society.

In 2008, Dr. McClelland was named dean of UToledo's College of Arts and Sciences, retiring from the University in 2011.

The dean emerita and professor emerita also served as executive-in-residence in the College of Business and Innovation.
