Jeff Grabarkiewicz attended the University of Toledo and completed a M.S. degree in Biology/Ecology in 2012. He also holds a B.S. in Biochemistry from Eastern Michigan University. During his time at UT, Jeff published numerous research papers with Drs. Crail and Gottgens on mussel and fish communities in Lake Erie area and its tributaries.

After graduation, Jeff took a position as a Permit Coordinator for the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT), where he was involved in permitting the \$100 million reconstruction of I-75.
