New Students (Combined)

Fall 2006 Highlights

- The University of Toledo's new student population has become more ethnically diverse, as the percentages of Black and Hispanic students have increased since Fall 2004 (see Table 1.2).
- Enrollment of new students has increased in the Colleges of Arts & Sciences, Engineering, and Business, as enrollment of new students has decreased in the Student Success Center and the College of Education (see Table 1.4).
- The top three majors with the most new student enrollments are Undecided, Pre-Pharmacy, and Pre-Business (see Table 1.6).
 - While Undecided is the top major, the percent of new students with Undecided as a major has dropped from 13.5 in Fall 2004 to 12.0 in Fall 2006.
- The average high school grade point average of all incoming new students for Fall 2006 is 3.07, which is up from 3.03 in 2004 (see Table 1.8).
- The University of Toledo has attracted 320 out-of-state new students this fall, which is an increase of 134 students over the last two fall terms (see Table 1.9).
- Other than Ohio and Michigan, the top four states new students came from are Illinois, Indiana, Pennsylvania, and New York (see Table 1.10).

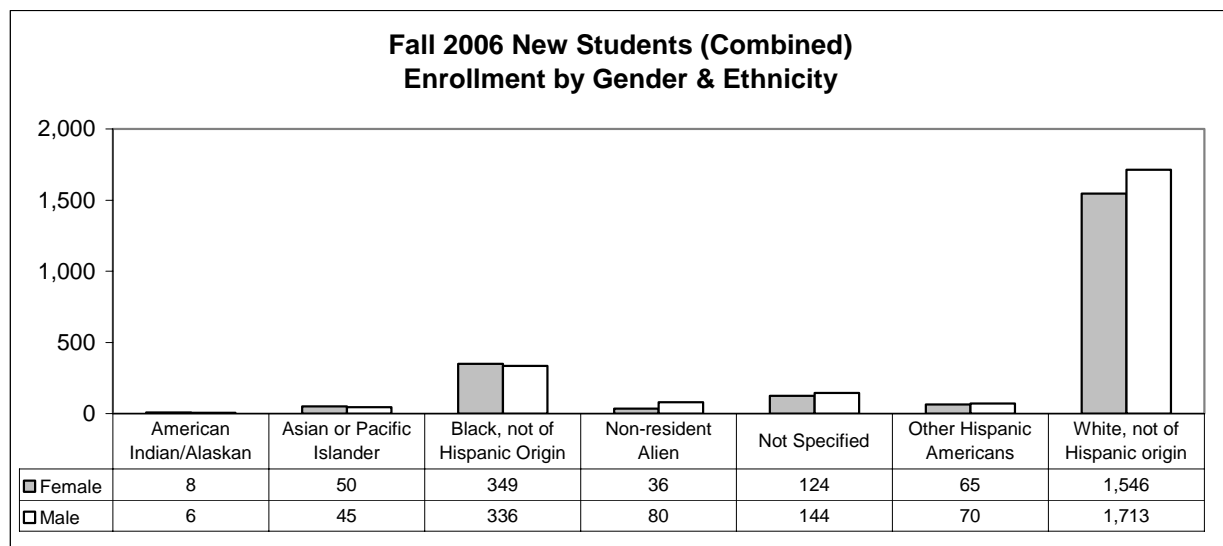

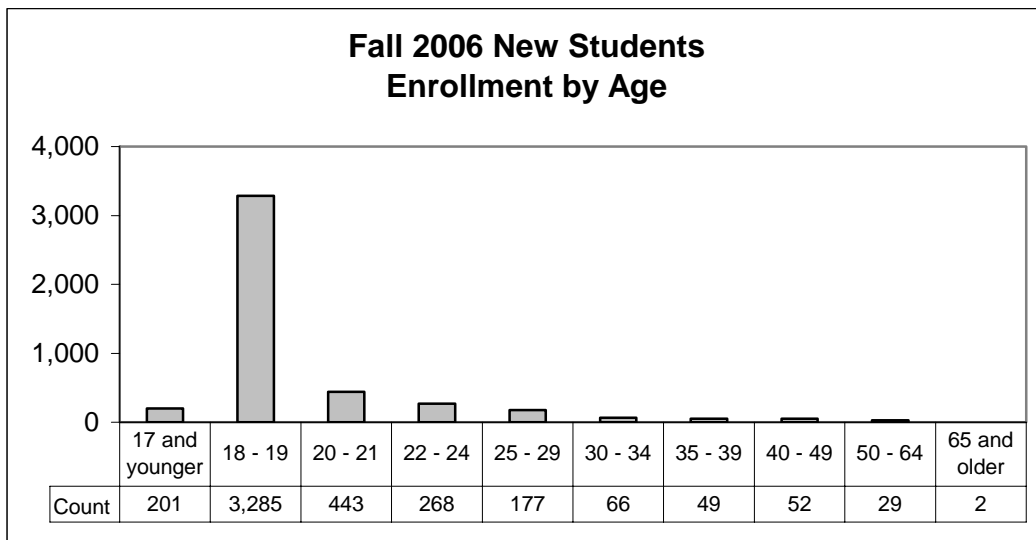

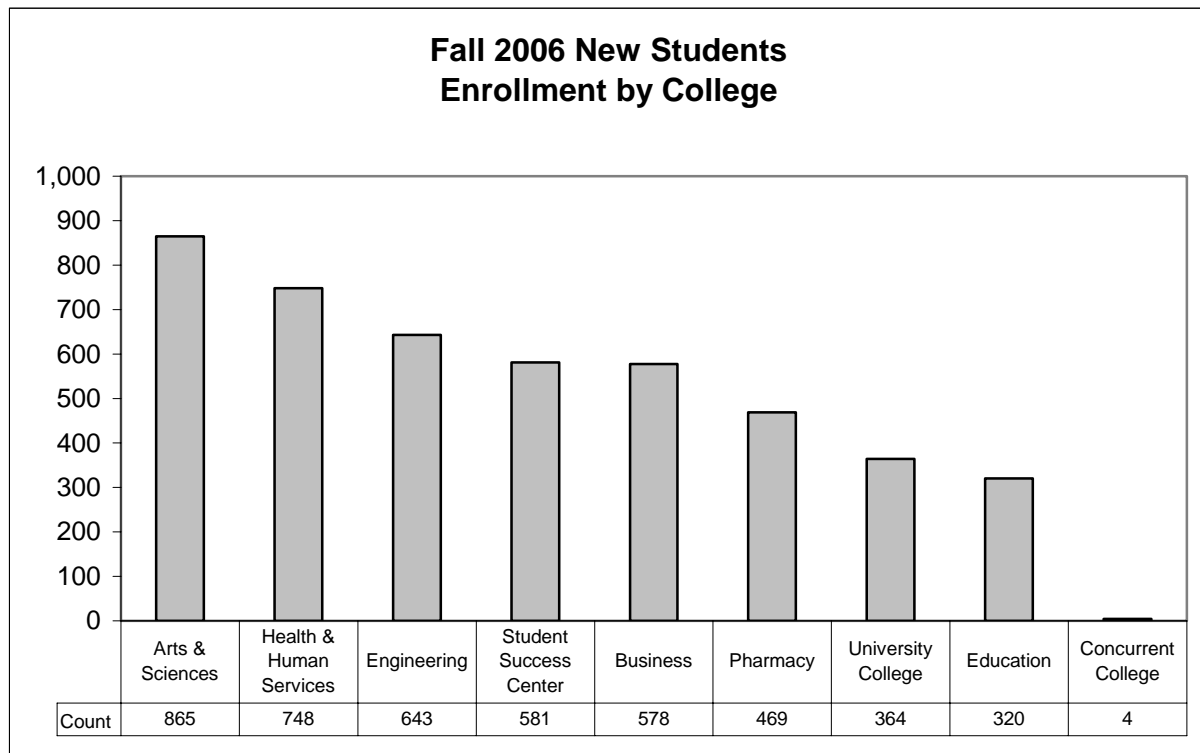

New DHS Students Fall 2006 Highlights

- The University of Toledo's Fall 2006 new direct from high school (DHS) student population has become more ethnically diverse than the previous two fall terms, with increased numbers of Black and Hispanic students (see Table 2.2).
- Enrollment of new DHS students has increased in the College of Arts & Sciences and the College of Business since Fall 2004, and has decreased in the College of Education and the College of Health & Human Services (see Table 2.4).
- The top three majors with the most new DHS student enrollments are Undecided, Pre-Pharmacy, and Pre-Major (see Table 2.6).
 - While Undecided is the top major, the percent of new DHS students with Undecided as a major has dropped from 14.2 in Fall 2004 to 13.5 in Fall 2006.
- New DHS students have come from 602 different high schools, with the top feeder schools being Central Catholic, Sylvania Northview, Sylvania Southview, and Whitmer (see Table 2.8).
- Since Fall 2004, overall academic preparedness has increased for the new DHS student population.
 - The average high school GPA of the incoming DHS students has gone up from 3.07 in Fall 2004 to 3.12 in Fall 2005 and has remained about steady at 3.10 in Fall 2006 (see Table 2.9).
 - The average ACT score has also increased from 21.4 in Fall 2004 to 21.8 in Fall 2005, and remained about the same at 21.7 this term (see Table 2.10).
- The University has attracted more out-of-state and Michigan reciprocity DHS students this fall (111 and 138 students respectively) when compared to the last two fall terms (see Table 2.11).
- Aside from Ohio and Michigan, the states in which the most DHS students come from are Illinois, Indiana, and Pennsylvania (see Table 2.12).

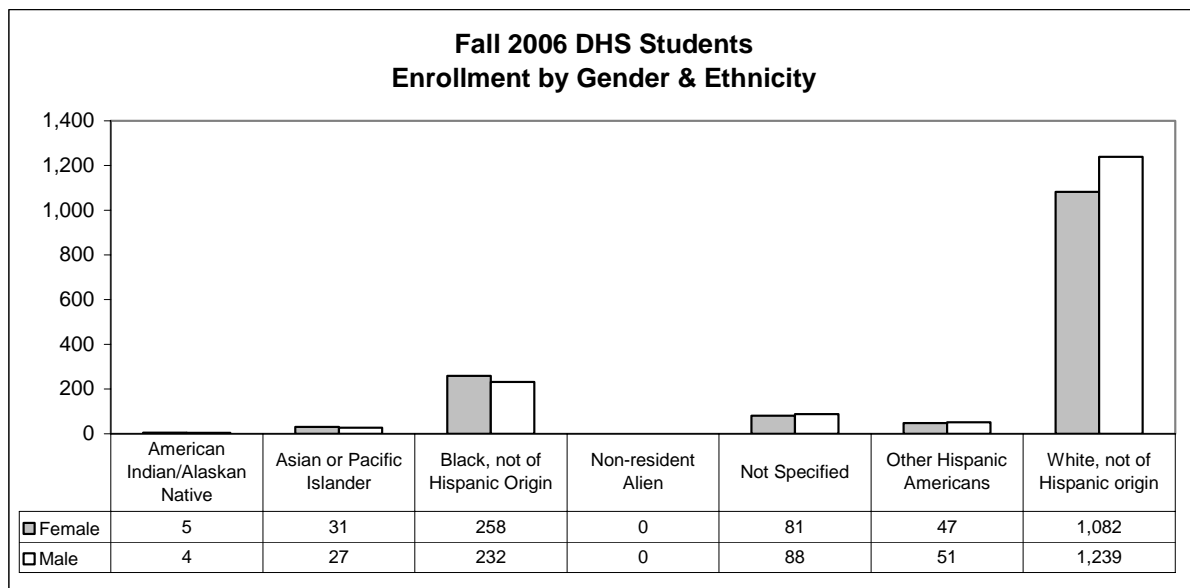

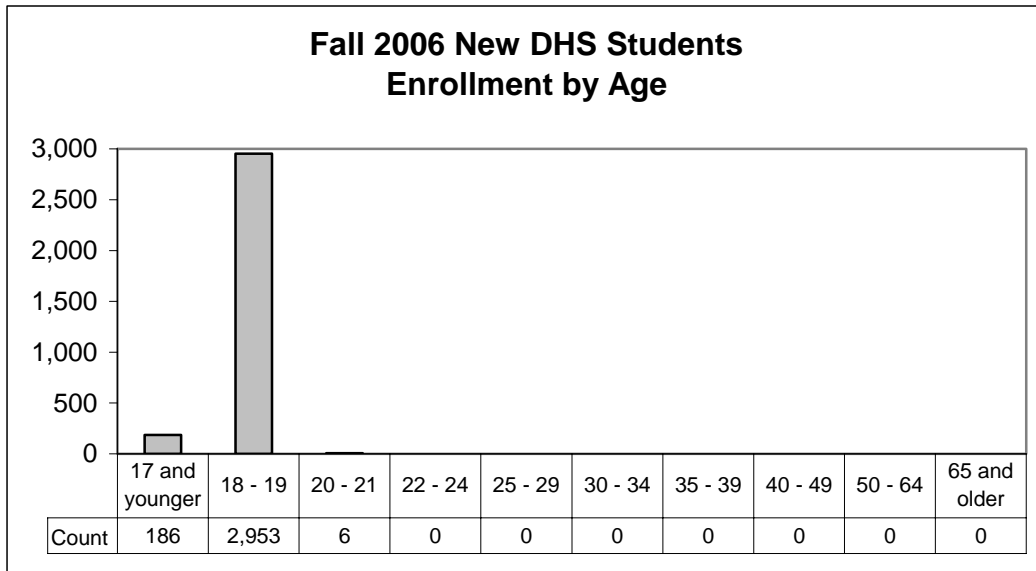

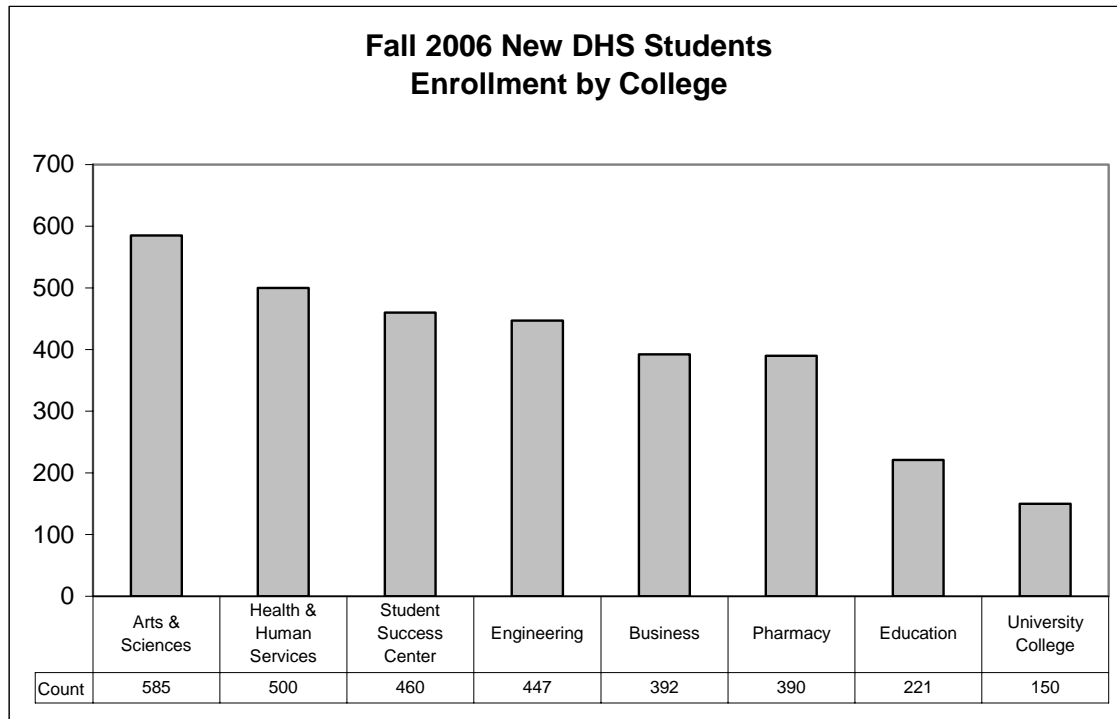

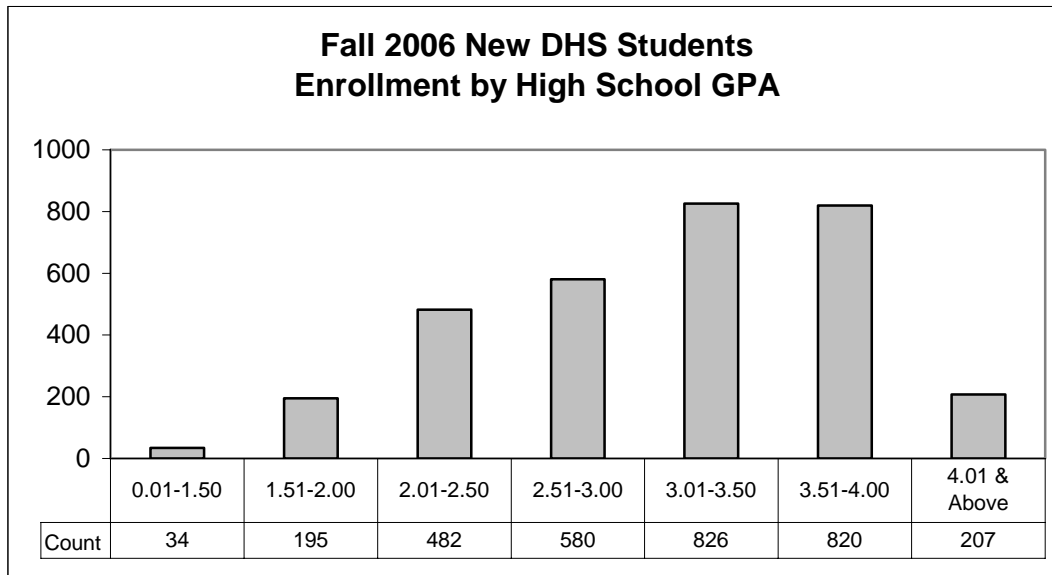

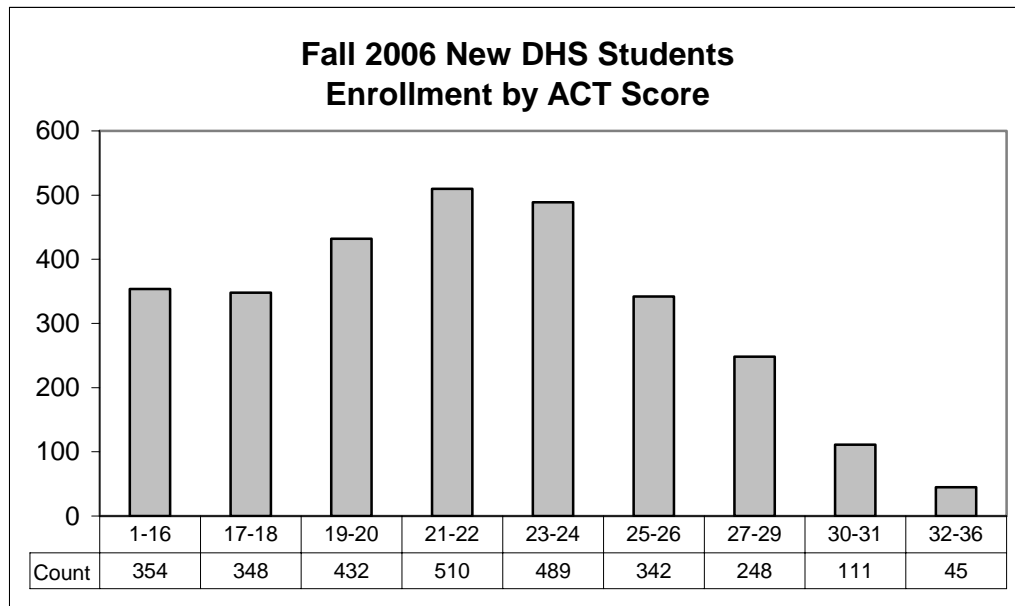

New Adult Students

Fall 2006 Highlights

- The ethnic breakdown of the new adult student population has become more diverse, as the percentage of Black students has increased, while the percentage of White students has decreased since Fall 2004 (see Table 3.2).
- Enrollment of new adult students has increased in the College of Arts & Sciences and the Student Success Center, and has decreased in the Colleges of Education and Business and University College (see Table 3.4).
- The top four majors with the most new adult student enrollments are Undecided, Special Undecided, Pre-Pharmacy and Pre-Major (see Table 3.6).
 - While Undecided is the top major, the number of new adult students with Undecided as a major has dropped from 74 in Fall 2004 to 55 in Fall 2006.
- About 71% of the new adult student population has enrolled for a full course load this fall, which is a notable increase over Fall 2004 when about 64% of the new adult student population was enrolled full-time (see Table 3.7).
- The percentage of out-of-state new adult students has increased this fall to 5.5, compared to 4.9 in Fall 2005 and 2.3 Fall 2004 (see Table 3.9).

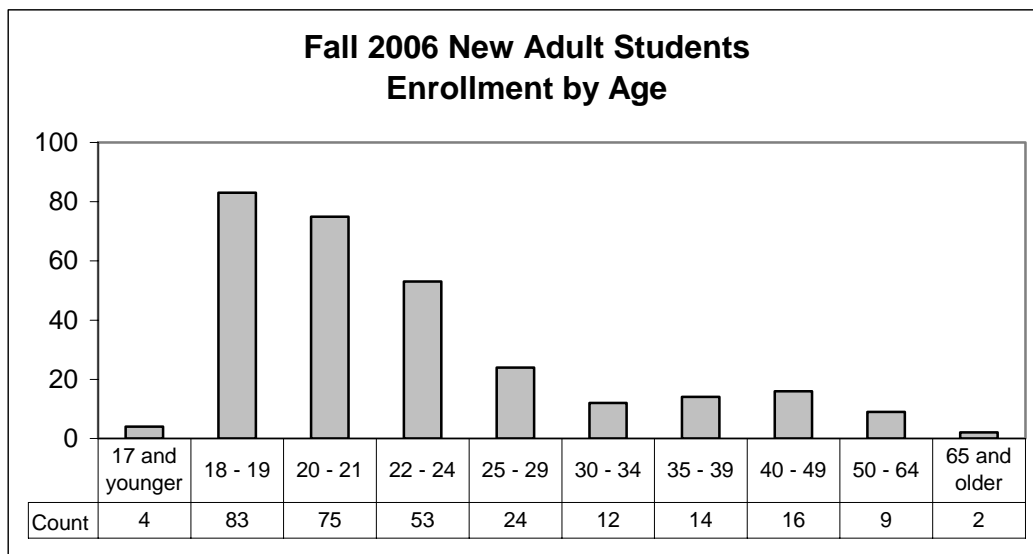

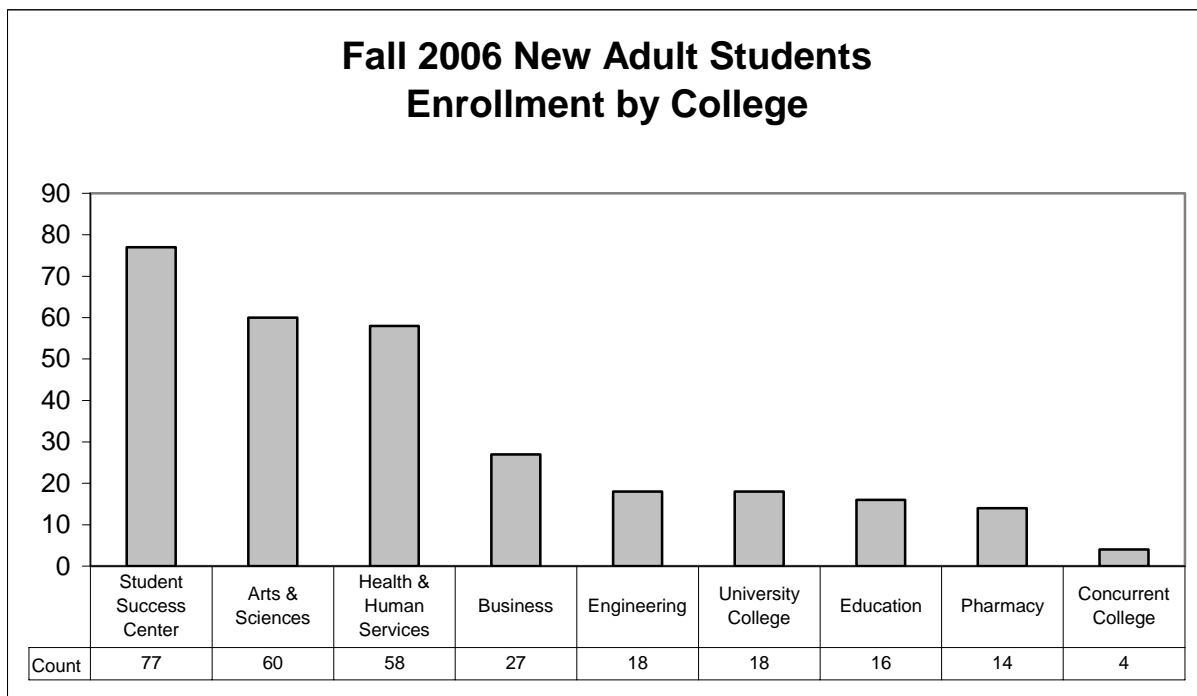

New Transfer Students

Fall 2006 Highlights

- The University of Toledo's Fall 2006 new transfer student population has remained relatively stable in terms of diversity when compared to the previous two fall terms (see Table 4.3).
- Enrollment of new transfer students has increased in the Colleges of Arts & Sciences and Health & Human Services and has decreased in the Student Success Center and the College of Education (see Table 4.5).
- The top three majors with the most new transfer student enrollments, aside from Conditional are Undecided, Pre-Pharmacy, and Pre-Business (see Table 4.7).
 - While Undecided is one of the top majors, the percentage of new transfer students with Undecided as a major has dropped from 7.8 in Fall 2004 to 5.9 in Fall 2006.
- The average cumulative transfer grade point average of the new fall transfer students is 2.67, which has remained steady since Fall 2004 when the average was the same (see Table 4.9).
- The top three 4-year public institutions from which new Fall 2006 transfer students have transferred to the University of Toledo are Bowling Green State University, Ohio State University, and Kent State University (see Table 4.12).
- The top two 2-year public institutions from which new Fall 2005 transfer students have transferred are Owens Community College and Monroe County Community College (see Table 4.13).
- The University of Toledo has attracted 84 out-of-state new transfer students this fall, which is an increase over the last two fall terms (see Table 4.14).

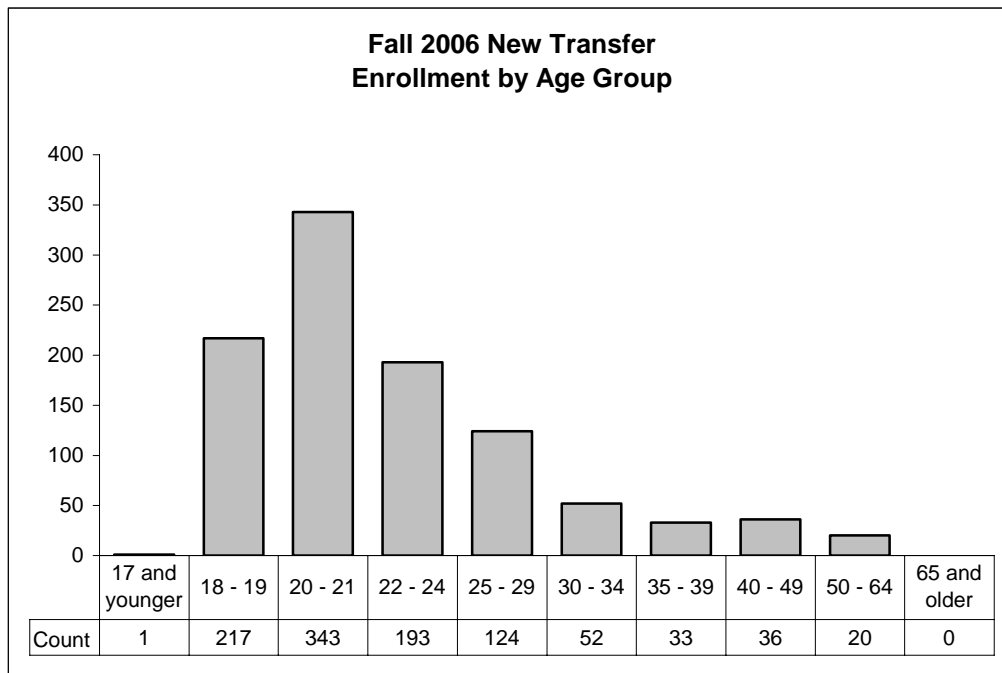

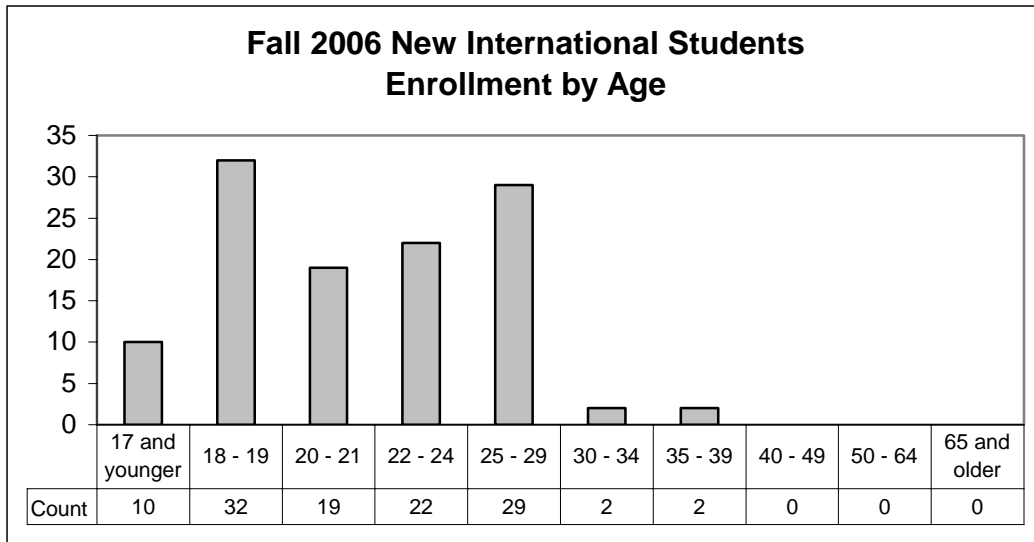

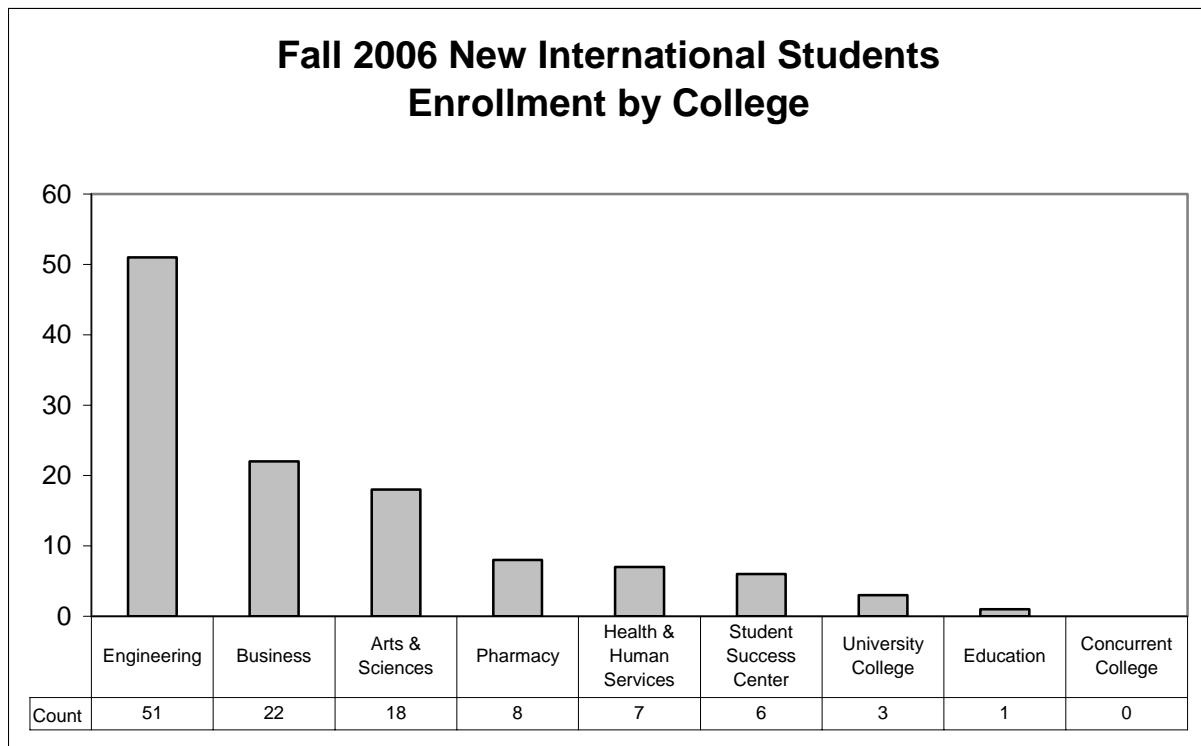

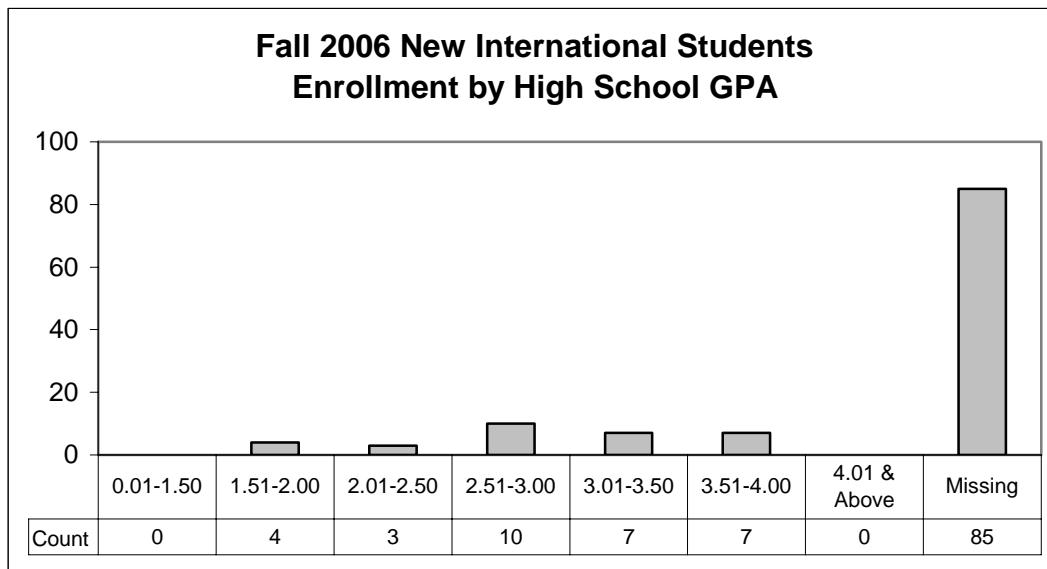
