ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF TOLEDO

The University of Toledo is one of 13 state universities in Ohio. We were established in 1872 and became a member of the state university system in 1967. The University of Toledo and the Medical University of Ohio merged July 2006 to form the third-largest public university operating budget in the state.

We offer more than 230 undergraduate, graduate and professional programs at colleges of:

- Arts and Sciences
- Business Administration
- Education
- Engineering
- Graduate Studies
- Health Science and Human Service
- Law
- Medicine
- Nursing
- Pharmacy
- University College

Some of our nationally ranked programs include business, engineering, law, and occupational therapy.

We also offer:

- Part-time and full-time options of study
- Day and evening classes
- One of the largest distance-learning programs in the nation

Main Campus features nine modern residence halls, a gothic bell tower, a Student Recreation Center, a state-of-the-art classroom center in one of our original buildings, Memorial Field House, which opened fall 2008, and a football stadium and new Savage Hall basketball and athletic complex, which opened in fall 2008.

Health Science Campus is home to graduate health programs and the UT Medical Center, a Level 1 trauma center, offering innovative treatments for strokes and cancer found nowhere else in the state. The UT Medical Center, also features the new \$5.8-million Orthopaedics Center.

At UT, we have researchers working at all levels — from undergraduates to faculty — toward our mission of improving the human condition. In fact,

their combined, efforts have led to 125 patents and nearly \$60 million in funding and grants. Whether your interest is diabetes, performance management, bio-fuels, or Shakespeare, we welcome you to join us in research.

We also are transforming the regional economy and the world through UT's Innovation Enterprises, which identifies, facilitates, stimulates and supports commercial activity aligned with UT's mission, and where faculty and students and community partners are able to launch their ideas into viable businesses in a rich entrepreneurial environment.

And our campuses are quite the happening (and fun) places to be — with 200 student organizations, art exhibits, theater performances, athletic games, and renowned speakers such as Robert F. Kennedy Jr.

POINTS OF PRIDE

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- The University of Toledo is recognized as a major force in contributing to the discovery of new technology and knowledge. UT offers a vast array of resources for undergraduate, graduate and faculty-led research opportunities with 125 patents and \$60 million in research and grants;
- The UT Honors Program is one of the oldest programs of its kind at a major university. With an emphasis on undergraduate research opportunities, the Honors Program has sent a delegation to the National Conference on Undergraduate Research every year since 1992.
- UT offers a health education curriculum that includes programs in virtually every health-care discipline, plus opportunities for educational linkages and interdisciplinary studies between the Colleges of Medicine, Engineering, Business, Law and the Department of Philosophy.
- The UT Department of Art offers students a unique learning experience with an on-site relationship with the world-renowned Toledo Museum of Art.
- The University of Toledo College Of Law is ranked in the top 100 in the nation by U.S. News and World Report, and is ranked first in Ohio for first-time bar exam passage rates.
- The UT College of Engineering graduate programs were ranked 18th in the nation by the Princeton Review.
- The University of Toledo Medical Center is one of 15 major teaching hospitals chosen by Solucient's annual "Top 100 Hospitals: Performance Improvement Leaders," compiled by Modern Healthcare magazine.
- Our students are among the winners of prestigious national fellowships, including the Fulbright, the Woodrow Wilson, the National Science Foundation Graduate Fellowship, the National Consortium for the Physical Sciences, the Whitaker Foundation, the Goldwater, the Madison Foundation Fellowship, and the Phi Kappa Phi National Fellowship.
- The University of Toledo is home to five of seven northwest Ohio physicians listed as "America's Top Doctors". Fewer than one percent of physicians nationwide are recognized with this designation.
- UT's graduate program in occupational therapy is ranked in the top 10 percent nationwide by U.S. News and World Report.
- The University was recently listed in "100 Best Colleges for African-American Students."
- Centennial Mall on the Main Campus is one of the "100 most beautifully landscaped places in the country," according to the American Society of Landscape Architects. Only 22 college campuses are on the list.
- The University of Toledo College of Medicine senior graduates "matched" at a higher rate than those of other seniors nationwide for the second year in a row; a record 97 percent secured first-year residency positions during the initial National Residency Matching Program.
- The \$33 million Wolfe Hall, which opened in 1998, offers one of the most advanced science facilities of its kind in the nation supporting the College of Pharmacy.
- The University of Toledo has one of the largest distance-learning programs in the nation.
- The Lake Erie Research and Education Center is a state-of-the-art environmental research and teaching facility located on the shore of Lake Erie in Oregon, Ohio.
- The UT Student Recreation Center was touted as one of the best of its kind in the nation by USA Today.
- The University of Toledo is one of the largest employers in northwest Ohio with an impact of over one billion dollars.



The University of Toledo and the Medical University of Ohio merged July 1, 2006, to form the third-largest public university operating budget in the state.

House Bill 478 was signed on March 31, 2006, by Gov. Bob Taft, creating a university built around eleven academic colleges and professional programs matched only by a handful of public universities nationwide, including Ohio State University and the University of Michigan.

UT's main campus, located along the banks of the Ottawa River in a residential section of the city, includes historic buildings, modern facilities, contemporary residence halls and lots of green space.

The University of Toledo Health Science Campus is home to UT Medical Center hospitals and clinics and many of UT's health-science research and education programs that are teaching the next generation of physicians, nurses and other health care professionals.

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
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HISTORICAL ENROLLMENT



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
ENROLLMENT BY FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME

for Fall Semester in Academic Years 2001-02 through 2010-11 continued


PERCENT OF FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATES FOR FALL 2010



WHO ARE THE FALL 2010 PART-TIME STUDENTS?




PERCENT FULL-TIME BY STUDENT LEVEL



for Fall Semester in Academic Year 2010-11


UNDERGRADUATE WOMEN

N=9,019 - 50% of Total Ugrad Enrollment




GRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL WOMEN

for Fall Semester in Academic Years 2001-02 through 2010-11





ENROLLMENT BY AGE









GRADUATION RATES OF NEW FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS












FEMALE FACULTY

FEMALE FACULTY AS PERCENT OF FACULTY BY RANK




MINORITY FACULTY




2005-10 FEDERAL AND NON-FEDERAL AWARDS





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




