The University of Toledo and the Medical University of Ohio merged July 2006 to form the third-largest public university operating budget in the state. AMONG THE BEST IN THE REGION, U.S. AND ABROAD

- ◆ #1 – UT is the best four-year college in Ohio for affordability flexibility and student services, according to a 2017 ranking by Schools.com, an online source for education information.
- ◆ #2 – UT is second in the state for its number of degrees offered via distance education (46); 36 percent of UT students are enrolled in at least some online coursework, according to Schools.com.






ENROLLMENT BY FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME

For Fall Semester in Academic Year 2008 through 2017


Percent of Full-Time Undergraduates for Fall 2017






ENROLLMENT BY AGE





Assignable Square Feet by Major Function






