The University of Toledo and the Medical University of Ohio merged July 2006 to form the third-largest public university operating budget in the state. AMONG THE BEST IN THE REGION, U.S. AND ABROAD

- ◆ #1 – UToledo is the best four-year college in Ohio for affordability flexibility and student services, according to a 2017 ranking by Schools.com, an online source for education information.
- ◆ #2 – UToledo is second in the state for its number of degrees offered via distance education (46); 36% of UToledo students are enrolled in at least some online coursework, according to Schools.com.
- ◆ #4 – UToledo is ranked No. 4 in Ohio for its selection of degrees available on campus by Schools.com.
- ◆ Top 5% – The 2016 UToledo College of Medicine and Life Sciences' internal medicine residents scored in the top 5% on a national exam by the American College of Physicians. The class matched to many different specialty fellowships at prestigious institutions, including Johns Hopkins University, Mayo Clinic, the University of Michigan and Georgetown University.
- ◆ Top Education Award – The University of Toledo was selected among 400 U.S. public colleges and universities by The American Association of State Colleges and Universities to receive the 2017 Christa McAuliffe Award for Excellence in Teacher Education. The award recognizes UToledo's excellence and innovation for NURTURES, an early childhood science program that aims to improve the science readiness scores of preschool through third grade students.
- ◆ Among Top Research Universities – According to the 2018 Times Higher Education World University Rankings, UToledo is ranked among the world's top research universities. Among 1,000 ranked institutions across approximately 80 countries, which represents 5% of the world's higher education institutions, UToledo is listed in the 501 – 600 range based on teaching, research, citations, knowledge transfer and international outlook.
- ◆ The Best for Lowest Debt – LendEDU announced in 2017 that UToledo graduates have the lowest student loan debt among all of Ohio's public colleges. The average student loan debt per borrow for UToledo's class of 2016 was \$24,437.
- ◆ Top 100 – UToledo's College of Business and Innovation's undergraduate program ranks among *Bloomberg Business Week's* top 100 business schools.
- ◆ Top 300 – The UToledo College of Business and Innovation's MBA ranks among *Princeton Review's* top 300 MBA programs in the U.S.
- ◆ UToledo was selected to join the prestigious Association of Universities for Research in Astronomy as its 41st member.
- ◆ The UToledo College of Engineering co-op program is listed in the "Best of Co-Op" category by the World Association for Cooperative Education.

- ◆ UToledo ranked among the "Best for Vets" universities by Military Times in both 2016 and 2017.

- ◆ For the third consecutive semester, the UToledo women's swimming and diving program was nationally recognized by the College Swimming and Diving Coaches Association of America for its fall 2017 combined grade point average of 3.49.
- ◆ *Moody's* and *Standard & Poor's* both reaffirmed the University's rating in 2017 with a stable outlook, indicating a solid foundation.
- ◆ CollegeNET currently ranks UToledo as the top institution in northwest Ohio for social mobility.
- ◆ UToledo currently ranks No. 2 in Ohio among Carnegie-classified public research institutions, validating that a UToledo degree is an essential tool for economic and social advancement.
- ◆ Seventy-six percent of UToledo's baccalaureate graduates are employed in the state of Ohio within one year after graduation, according to the Ohio Department of Jobs and Family Services in 2017.
- ◆ *Consumer Reports* named UTMC among the top 32 teaching hospitals in the country for reducing central-line infection rates in the intensive care unit by 55% over the past five years.






ENROLLMENT BY FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME

For Fall Semester in Academic Year 2010 through 2019


Percent of Full-Time Undergraduates for Fall 2019



For Fall Semester in Academic Year 2010 through 2019






ENROLLMENT BY AGE












2018—19 Numbers of Buildings by campus


