




ENROLLMENT BY FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME

For Fall Semester 2016 through 2020


Enrollment by Course Load and Student Level (2020)


ENROLLMENT BY OHIO RESIDENCY AND STUDENT LEVEL




ENROLLMENT BY AGE
















