Dr. Gaber provided comments about the Dashboard Report. She reported that research numbers for the first quarter of FY18 have significantly outperformed as compared to the same time last year – the number of research proposal submissions are up 23%, the number of awards are up 63%, and total reward dollars are up 64%.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

For FY12-FY16, the Association of University Technology Managers ranked UT, per \$10 million in research expenditures in the state of Ohio, as follows:

- 1<sup>st</sup> Invention disclosures (up one spot)
- 1<sup>st</sup> Licenses / options
- 1<sup>st</sup> Reimbursement of patent fees
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Start-ups formed
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Total license income

The First Annual Day of Giving, "Rocket Forward," held on October 12 yielded \$453,857, which surpassed the 24-hour goal. Gifts totaled 1,604.

The University of Toledo is poised to receive the largest gift in UT history – Welltower Corporate Headquarters.

Earlier this month both Moody's and Standard & Poor's reaffirmed the University ratings. They viewed the diversity of UT's programs and two years of enrollment stability as positive results.

### **Student Centered**

Dr. Gaber reported that the University has concluded an active and successful fall semester. The transition to a 15-week semester aligned with our peers and will help students with time to degree. With second-year students now living on campus, student programs and activities have increased. Activity on-campus outside of our peak hours is essential as it relates to the student experience and student retention.

We are excited and pleased to be a part of the opportunity to establish fixed pricing for our student via the Toledo Tuition Guarantee starting Fall 2018.

The newly renovated Carlson Library has resulted in a 40% increase in student study space utilization compared to last fall.

Social media on the academic side with Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram ranked 14 out of 338 Division I schools (Source: Rival IQ, a social media analytics company in Seattle).
