(A) Policy statement

Major revision of existing policy

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The University of Toledo Medical Center has oversight over the number of trainees or individuals interested in participating in health care experiences at UTMC or UT-COM<u>LS</u> related affiliate sites.

Reaffirmation of existing policy

(B) Purpose of policy

The purpose of this policy is to define the process by which UTMC will allow observers who are not enrolled in medical school to observe the delivery of clinical care at UTMC or affiliated sites. UTMC will UTCOMLS must ensure that observerships shadowing does not compromise patient safety, efficient operation of UTMC, or the integrity of the learning environment for UT students.

An observer is defined as This policy applies to anyone who is not a medical student, physician or healthcare provider who has an interaction with a patient in the clinical environment.

(C) Scope:

This policy applies to observers at UTMCall individuals requesting shadowing at UTMC orf an affiliated clinical site. Medical students, residents and physicians who have completed medical school training are excluded from this policy. UTMC does not allow residents and physicians to participate in observerships. sShadowing.

(D) Definition

Observership Shadowing: Shadowing An observership is an observational experience that does not constitute training. Observers do not participate in direct or indirect patient care or management. Observers do not receive any form of certification or evaluation at the end of their observership shadowing period.

(E) Procedure

Individuals who have graduated from any medical school may **not** -perform observershipsparticipate in shadowing at UTMC or its affiliated sites. High school or college undergraduate students may apply for a time-limited observership not exceeding one week (in a specific discipline or specific clinical service), by completing an application-reaching out to UTMC Compliance. A form is available for download at http://uthealth.utoledo.edu/depts/volunteer/shadowprogram.html No one -may perform an observershipparticipate in shadowing unless approved by the Office of Clinical Placement in the Office Department of Medical Education. In addition, all observers must provide documentation of health and immunization requirements, and criminal background check. <u>UTCOM DMEUTMC Compliance</u> will verify the credentials of each observer, maintain a complete roster of observers, and approve the assignments of each observer. Individual faculty <u>and staff</u> members may not allow observers to participate in the clinical environment without explicit and written approval from UTCOM<u>LS</u> and the Department of Medical Education. Violation of this policy may result in disciplinary action based on professionalism policy.

- (1) Applications for observership shadowing will be submitted to the Department of Medical Education prior to the start of any observership clinical shadowing activity.
- (2) Approval of attending physician and clinical service will be necessary prior to starting the observership shadowing as well. Faculty sponsors are responsible for oversite of all observers. No university employee shall supervise/oversee any person closely related by law, blood, marriage, or significant relationship. This is in conjunction with the university's Conflict of Interest and Nepotism policy (Policy # 3364-25-18). It is the responsibility of sponsoring department to assure observers are displaying a UT issued badge at all times.
- (3) Upon approval of the application, students may be assigned as observers depending on availability of faculty members willing to have observers and the number of medical students and other trainees at that site.
- (4) Physician Assistants, nurses, pharmacists, and other health professionals need specific, written approval from their respective colleges and coordination with their colleges at University of Toledo prior to assignment as observers.

(5) Failure to comply with this policy may result in disciplinary action for staff, students, and faculty members.
