## (A) Policy Statement

Observation services are those services that include use of a bed and periodic monitoring by nursing and medical staff that are reasonable and necessary to evaluate a patient's condition and/or to determine the need for possible inpatient admission or discharge.

# (B) Purpose of Policy

The purpose of observation service is to determine the need for further treatment/assessment for possible inpatient admission or for appropriateness of discharge. Observation should provide a higher level of care than a clinic setting or home care; but is not considered an actual hospital admission. Observation service may be initiated in any procedure area for complications arising from scheduled surgeries and procedures.

## (C) Procedure

#### Physician

- 1. There must be a written physician order for observation services. This order must specify "place in observation services for monitoring of ......" The patient must meet InterQual criteria for observation status.
- 2. The physician should re-evaluate the patient within 24 hours to determine whether to discharge the patient or admit as an inpatient, if InterQual criteria for inpatient admission are met.
- 3. Consultations should be completed as soon as possible since the decision to admit, or discharge must be made following the consultation.
- 4. Services not appropriate for observation status include:
  - a. Routine monitoring during the standard post-operative or post-procedural recovery period up to 6 hours.
  - b. Conditions that meet -CMS's "inpatient only" designation.
  - c. Basic outpatient procedure (BOP) patients requiring recovery greater than 6 hours who do not meet criteria for observation or admission.

5. The medical record must include a dated and timed order for observation services, followed by an order for discharge or inpatient admission, history and physical and disposition note.

#### **Nursing**

- 1. Documentation must include the monitoring and observations as prescribed by the physician.
- 2. If the physician decides to admit the patient to inpatient, the physician or designee must enter an order into the Electronic Medical Record to change the status of a patient from Observation to Inpatient.
